
Parent contributions

We understand that things are very tight financially now, and that there is very little extra money around. However, we really need your contributions to help us to provide the little extras that we use with the children. Each week I spend about £50 on fruit; bread; yogurt; cereal; cheese for snacks for the children. We also buy shaving foam; flour; Cornflour to extend the activities we are able to give to the children. We ask for your contributions through 'ParentPay'. This is the best way for us to collect the money. Last month I said about how you could make the contributions on ParentPay and we were happy to help set it up if you had any problems. However, out of the 95 accounts we oversee we only received £45 in donations. Fewer than half of the accounts have been activated. This is not enough to pay for one weeks shopping. I have attached an envelope this month. Please if you have any spare change, could we have it, for the benefit of all the children.

Parent Governors

Would you like to know more about how schools a run, and how to make a difference? There has been no parent representative on the Governing board for nearly two years now. We have vacancies for two Parent governors. You would be expected to attend a minimum of six meetings a year, although if you join a committee there would be more. We try to make the times parent friendly, some of the meetings are whilst your child would be at school; others are in the evenings. We always try to finish by 8pm for evening meetings. This is an exciting time to be a Governor as we are working on some of the actions raised in the OFSTED report.

If you have FSM and a baby under 2yrs then when you register with the Children's center you will also get £15 for them. (Children are not entitled to their lunch being free until they are 3yrs - sorry not our decision. (3)

If you are struggling to cope, then please contact us. We can link you to the right places for support. Gill can also give Food bank vouchers which we know some families have found helpful.

Thank you to all the parents and carers who have worked with us whilst we wait for Barbara to start. She will be here from Monday!!!
