# Reception

We hope you all had a lovely break and are feeling refreshed for the exciting spring term ahead. We are so proud of how well the children have settled into Reception, and we are delighted to share what we have planned for the coming weeks. There is so much to look forward to as we continue to support the children's learning, confidence and independence.

This spring term our topic is Animals, and it will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to explore, ask questions and develop their curiosity about the world around them. Through stories, fun CHIL time activities and discussions, the children will learn about different animals, their habitats and how they grow and change.

In our literacy lessons this term, we will be focusing on The Little Red Hen and We're Going on a Bear Hunt. These stories will support the children in developing their understanding of story structure and characters. The children will be encouraged to retell the stories through role play and storytelling, helping them to grow in confidence and their oracy skills.

We are also excited to be introducing a new handwriting scheme this term. This scheme will support the children in forming their letters correctly, developing fine motor skills and generally building good writing habits. We are confident that with consistent practice and encouragement, the children will thrive in their writing!

In Spring 2, we have lots of exciting learning planned, including Science Week, where the children will take part in a range of amazing experiments. As part of our science learning, we will also be exploring lifecycles, and we are thrilled to share that we will be welcoming ducklings into Reception! This will be a very special experience for the children as they observe how the ducklings grow and change, name them and learn how to keep them safe.

Our P.E day will remain as a Tuesday. Please could you continue to ensure that your children come into school with fully labelled uniform and water bottles filled with water only. Their books will be changed on a Monday, so please make sure that they come in with their reading books ready to be swapped over. They are now in new phonics groups, so these books will be given in line with their reading level.

We are incredibly proud of how hard the children are working and how much they continue to grow in confidence. Thank you for your ongoing support at home - it really does make a difference. We cannot wait to see the children continue to thrive throughout the spring term.



# Year 1

## Maths

This term in Year 1 Maths, we will be developing children's confidence with numbers through practical activities, games, and problem-solving. This term we will be covering the following areas in Maths Addition and subtraction within 20, Place value within 50, Measurement - capacity and Multiplication and division: Count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

## English

In English Writing, children will continue to develop their independent writing skills as well as continuing to use Full stops, capital letters and finger spaces. We will also be developing the children's use of descriptive language based on Oliver Jeffers, Lost and Found. Children will be internalising a model text and innovating with it to produce their own versions based on the language and text features and structure. We will be continuing out work on handwriting and presentation as priorities.

In English Reading, we will be using Happy Poem by James Carter as a stimulus for developing the children's understanding of poetry. We will then be exploring fantasy genre through Beauty and the Beast.

# Year 2

We have an exciting term in year 2 as we dive straight into the new year!

In English we will be getting into some sticky situations and wish for solutions in our own creative writing stories as we explore STUCK.

We will also be finding out How to Catch a Star in Reading as we look closely at an Oliver Jeffers favourite.

In Maths we will be starting our multiplication and division unit, we will be taking a closer look at how we can use groups of 2, 5 and 10 to express both mathematic concepts.

We will continue our understanding of Materials this term and perform scientific experiments applying our scientific knowledge and skills by using the fair test method.

In Geography this half term we will be looking at the United Kingdom, deepening our understanding of the countries that make up the UK, the major cities within each country, the seas that surround them and what makes each country uniquely different to each other.

Computing will see us program a robot and Design and Technology will have us making healthy choices when making a smoothie.

# Year 3 & 4

## **Maths**

We will be covering two major Maths topics this term: Written Multiplication & Division and Fractions (Part 1).

In Multiplication and Division, we will be consolidating the core skills of related facts before mastering the classic column multiplication method. This will be followed by learning how to divide large numbers through grouping and sharing with exchanges and remainders.

In Fractions, we will be learning what a fraction is, how to calculate with them and convert between mixed numbers and improper fractions.

Children will continue to learn and revise their times tables up to  $12 \times 12$ . Reminder: children in Year 4 will be sitting the Multiplication Check later in the year – more details on this to follow.

## **English**

In English Writing, we will be developing the children's understanding of character based on The Sheep Pig by Dick King Smith. This will then be followed by writing persuasive leaflets based on the same text. In both cases, children will be internalising a model text and innovating with it to produce their own versions based on the language and text features and structure. We will be continuing our work on handwriting, presentation and grammar skills as priorities.

In English Reading, we will be using On the Ning Nang Nong by Spike Milligan as a stimulus for developing the children's understanding of poetry. We will then be exploring a fantasy story called Leon and the Space Between.

# Year 3 & 4

# Year 5 & 6

## English

In English, children will be learning to apply a range of grammar features in their writing through a selection of texts. We begin with the poem 'The Jabberwocky' before moving on to 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty – an informative story set in Victorian times and based upon true events. Children will write in a number of genres, including instructions, an information text and a balanced argument. This will allow children to practise a range of grammar skills: figurative language, similes, metaphors, complex sentences, parenthesis, passive voice, relative clauses and ambitious vocabulary.

## Maths

In mathematics, our focus this term is on fractions, decimals and percentages, including converting from one form to another. Throughout the term, students will explore and investigate higher level application of mathematical concepts, such as statistics, as well as developing their skills in reasoning and problem solving. A quick recall of multiplication tables helps children with all aspects of maths, therefore please encourage your child to practise daily.

**History** – This term, children will be learning about The Victorians. Working as historians, children will ask questions about key figures and events and consider how they shaped the country, as well as developing an understanding of how life and opinions differed according to individual perspective.

**Geography** – Children will be learning about Natural Disasters, including earthquakes, volcanoes and floods, considering the impact of these on humans and nature.

**Science** – children will learn about Properties and Changes of Materials throughout the term. They will develop their scientific skills by hypothesising, predicting and collecting, presenting and analysing data.

## Class Information

Homework consists of spellings, TT Rockstars, and daily reading. Spellings will be set weekly and will be tested the following week. Reading books will be changed weekly.

Year 6 will be practising maths concepts taught during lessons on Learning By Questions. Homework will be set weekly.

PE will be on a Tuesday and Wednesday – please ensure your child has appropriate PE kit and footwear.

Please remind your child to bring their water bottles to school every day.
