
Over the year, Courage class have learnt some very interesting facts about different eras of history over the year, but we had some particularly engaging activities for our Ancient Egypt unit in spring term. Back in January, we had an immersive experience with Portals to the Past where we looked at ancient artefacts, discovered some weird and wonderful facts about life in ancient Egyptian times and even got to play some historical board games and sports.

Then in February, we had a Prime VR experience where we entered an Egyptian pyramid through the technology of a virtual reality headset and explored what mysteries were inside. Then to top it all off, we dedicated our Play in a Week, as part of our 50 Things, to Ancient Egypt. With only a week to prepare for it, Courage did an incredible job alongside the other Lower KS2 classes at putting on an incredible show for the school and for parents.

Recently, as part of our sense of SELF initiative and our 50 things to do before you leave Abbotsweld, Courage took a visit to Gibberd Gallery in the town centre and learned all about Gerda Rubenstein and her artwork that showcased her unique and special relationship with Harlow. Alongside Respect and Independence class, we took part in a range of activities to learn more about Gerda and her artwork including a drawing that interpreted her work which has been turned into a collage in the Gallery. The exhibition is free and open over the summer holidays, so it might be a nice activity to check out and see if you can spot your childs' work in the collage!

Additionally, we were visited by the Safety Seymour team and were taught all about what carbon monoxide is and how we can detect it in our homes. This has been an exciting task to work on our specific class value of 'Courage' as it takes a lot of courage to know the signs of carbon monoxide and feel brave and courageous to be able to help people to safety in the event of an emergency. Each of us got to take home a goody bag with a carbon monoxide alarm to keep us extra safe in our homes.







INDEPENDENCE

English

In English this term, the children have been learning how to write an explanation text and a suspense narrative using the Talk 4 Writing strategy. The children have been really successful at internalising model texts, analysing their features and innovating with them to create their own versions. We used 'Matilda' and the 'Paperbag Prince' as a stimuli for their amazing writing! The children enjoyed deepening their when researching methods to reduce waste in their homes and when Mr Hession became the character of 'Bruce' eating the chocolate cake!

Humanities

In History & Geography, we have had a major focus on Italy and the Roman civilisation. The children have enjoyed learning about cities, landmarks and the landscape of Italy. This unit encompassed a huge range of learning about the Roman Empire, the children have immersed themselves on why the romans were keen to spread their power and land ownership across Europe and why they invaded Britain in 55BC. Children creatively learned roman dancing during PE lessons this term. Role playing as Boudica was a hit during these lessons.

Music

Year 4 children have had the opportunity to learn recorder from an experienced music teacher who has tirelessly taught them the art of using this wind instrument. This was concluded with an outstanding and enthusiastic performance to the Key Stage 2 children, who were rightly impressed with their newly acquired skills.

Trip to Gibberd Gallery

We were invited to the Gibbered Gallery for an informative and creative learning experience, for which the children thoroughly enjoyed. The Gibberd Gallery is a visual arts space run by the Harlow Art Trust. It is home to the Sir Frederick Gibberd Watercolour Collection, several sculptures, and an annual programme of exhibitions. The bespoke timetable offered by the Gibberd Gallery, highlighted the historical aspects of Harlow town's many sculptures. The children enthusiastically as always, emulated their own versions of the artworks displayed. The impressed gallery staff have displayed them in the exhibition. What a fantastic opportunity for the children! It was an absolute pleasure to observe the children having the exposure to make choices based on their own context, in their communities' context and their world, as set out in the Sense of Self programme.







RESPONSIBILITY

What a term year 2 have had! The children have been busy across all curriculum subjects. In D&T the children have been busy learning about what makes a stable structure and then became engineers when they designed and constructed their very own windmill with a working turbine.

Similarly, in Science during the topic of 'Animals including humans' the children have been learning all about the different types of offspring including the lifecycles of both animals and humans and what they need to do to survive - which included discussions on eating healthily and the impacts of exercise.

In Computing, year 2 have been learning all about programming and algorithms and have used their knowledge to create animations within Scratch Jnr. Which is very impressive!

In Geography, the children have been learning all about 'Our world' including, the different names and locations of the 5 seas and oceans and the location of the 7 continents. They have also been identifying daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom as well as the locations of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator and North and South Poles.

All the children have worked so hard in year 2, as well as learning about the different climates in Geography the children also learned about how seaside's in the UK have changed over the past 100 years and this week we went on a brilliant trip to Southend Beach and participated in workshops inside the Sea life Aquarium, where we learned all about

Talk4writing


