Read for a minimum of 20 minutes each day. Record the challenges in your homework book. For some, you may just need to ask an adult at home to sign to confirm that you have completed it!

Write a new blurb for the back of one of your books.	What was the best part of one of your books? Draw a picture to show it.	Design a new front cover for a book – how will you make it look different?	Using pictures, show how a non-fiction text is set out.	Read a comic or magazine. Draw your favourite part.
Think of two questions you would like to find the answer to in a non-fiction book. Read the book to answer the questions.	Read part of your book to a friend putting in as much expression as you can. Ask them to comment in your reading record.	Write down any new words you have read. Use a dictionary to find out the meaning of the words and record the definitions.	Draw your favourite character from a story. Use adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe them.	Draw a mind map of everything you have found out in a non-fiction book.
Share read a book with an adult at home. Who can add the most expression?	Write a book review to persuade someone else to read your book.	KS2	Write a list of features you might find in a non- fiction book. E.g. contents page.	Read something online. Summarise what you have read in your homework book.
Read and read a poem until you can remember every word.	Copy out two sentences or phrases from a book that you really like. Explain why you like them.	In two sentences, write down the main event in a recent book you have read.	Read a book in an unusual place and take a photo.	Write 5 questions you would like to ask the author of your book.
Over the course of a day, write down each time you need to use your reading skills. How many times did you read?	Retell a story you have read to an adult. Can you add actions?	Plan and write a different ending to the book you have read.	Read a poem and draw a picture of how it makes you feel.	Read a recipe and have a go at making it.

Over this half term, try and complete as many challenges from the bingo board as you can.



Bronze Award: Complete one row – across, down or diagonal and you will receive a reading sticker and an additional 5 house points ©



Silver Award: Complete two rows – across, down or diagonal and you will receive your very own reading book mark and an additional 10 house points ©
