The PTA fund many things for the school that benefit the children, such as workshop days and additional curriculum resources that the school budget can't stretch to, along with year 6 leavers' hoodies and their end of year trip. The large project we are aiming to fund is replacing the Trim Trail on the school field. This much loved and well used piece of equipment is nearly at the end of its life and will cost around £10,000 to fully replace. We also talked about plans for Spring and beyond and want to make sure that there is a full calendar of events to benefit the children in our school and also to continue with the essential fund-raising work. After Christmas, we will be hosting a children's disco in the school hall and would also love to host a quiz night in school and will be looking for a Quizmaster to help us!

To be able to run all the events we have planned, we still need more people to volunteer to join the PTA and commit some time to helping plan events. Large events such as the summer fair take a considerable amount of time and effort and this works best if we can share our jobs at the planning stage.
