Reflections from this year

As the school year comes to an end, Mrs Warner and I have, once again reflected on the successes of the year, in order to plan ahead to the next one. It's been a busy year bringing many changes to Aberford, not least in our academisation to join Selby Educational Trust in April this year. This term has been mostly shifting systems but we have already started to work alongside the other schools and work next year will involve seeing us work collaboratively with different working groups and projects across the trusts. Mrs Warner and I also had the opportunity to visit an outstanding school in London which gave us lots of food for thought and inspiration for how we can make our school even better.

We have been delighted with our statutory assessment results and very proud of how hard staff and pupils worked to achieve these. When comparing our results to national, please do remember that our small cohorts mean that each child is worth a large percentage so it can be hard to make accurate comparisons.

Our nursery and reception class has gone from strength to strength and we were delighted to be approached by other schools wanting to come and observe our good practice to help them embed mixed aged learning in early years in their own school. In September, Mrs Sharp is taking part in a trial project on movement in the early years which we hope will bring us lots of new ideas to help our youngest children even further.

We continue to celebrate the successes of our phonics scheme and were delighted with our 100% pass mark for the year 1 phonics screening this year. We have also been very proud to showcase our work on phonic fluency to a school from another local authority who wanted to come and observe our good practice here.

Children have enjoyed some exciting school trips this year and have seen many visitors into school. Our Key Stage 2 Young Voices trip to Sheffield is becoming a bit of a much loved tradition and we are planning next January's trip already! We have held a wide variety of afterschool clubs throughout the year and the uptake on these has been great. We have strived to keep costs low for these for parents and to ensure high uptake but we will need to ask for small amounts again for clubs such as cooking, crafts and Young Voices to cover costs. Our school council has had a very busy and successful year, from sponsored events to art competitions and environmental issues.



In September, we are launching an exciting new project for children in every year group called Junior Duke. Junior Duke is a life skills award that helps children build confidence, resilience and independence. Each level of the award pushes them to develop practical skills that have a huge positive impact on their lives. We will get more information out to you as soon as possible in September so we can get off to a flying start!

Our PTA have had a fantastic year, raising so much money and organising super events. Replacing the trim trail was a particular highlight of the year and we are so glad so have it for future generations of children to use. We plan to continue raising funds to try and extend the trim trail to be even better!

It's been an amazing year and we are looking forward to the next academic year and the exciting opportunities for Aberford that this may bring!

Finally, a big thank you to all the Aberford community: the children, the staff and to you all – the amazing families for all your continued support. Have a lovely summer everyone and we will see you all again on Tuesday 2nd September!
