Year 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Name & locate world's continents and oceans Compare local area to a non-European country Use basic vocabulary to describe a less familiar area Use aerial images and other models to create simple plans and maps, using symbols Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the immediate environment
