

Year 7 Catch-Up Premium

The Year 7 catch-Up premium has been offered by the Government as a commitment to provide additional funding to schools. This is aimed at each year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least NC level 4 or a standardised score of 100 in the Key Stage 2 national curriculum tests in reading and/or mathematics¹. The purpose of this funding is to enable Worden to deliver additional support for those pupils that most need it.

Year 7 Catch-Up Premium 2020-21

The government have discontinued the Y7 catch-up premium and therefore there will be no Y7 catchup report for 2020-21.

Year 7 Catch-Up Premium 2019-20

The amount of funding for 2019-20 was £18675. We spent this money in a variety of ways to support progress. This included:

- Small group and one to one intervention
- Teachers offering extra intervention and support in literacy and numeracy for Year 7 catch-up pupil
- In-class support for literacy and numeracy with TA time allocated to support students in English and Mathematics lessons
- Reading Intervention

Numeracy ONLY	9 pupils
BOTH Literacy and Numeracy	26 pupils
