




Alder goes to Rome



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From Water Bottles to Key Rings: Students Get Creative with CAD at **PrintCity!**

PrintCity, a 3D digital manufacturing centre based at Manchester Metropolitan University, invited our students to take part in an outreach day. This included a tour of PrintCity and an introduction to the PrintCity Network. They had the chance to engage with 3D prints made by several machines during the tour. Our students had the opportunity to interact with the prints rather than merely observe them. Students were given a tour of PrintCity's CIRMAP concrete printing research lab for the first time. Our students listened to a lecture on the use of CAD in real world advertising, tried their hand at creating their own water bottles on Autodesk Fusion 360, and got to create their very own 3D printed key rings.




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
