Line-up



- Before form (8:20am), you can check your seat on your individual exams timetable, or on the wall near A1

- Wait and listen to instructions


Rules and Behaviour

Rules and Behaviour


- No talking




Possession of unauthorised items, such as a mobile phone or any watch, is a serious offence and could result in

Equipment



- Clear/transparent water bottle NO LABELS
- Clear/transparent pencil case NO LABELS
- Bring more than one black biro, a pencil, ruler, rubber etc.
- Calculators are required for Maths, Science, Business Studies and Psychology
- If you require tracing paper, compass, protractor, etc., it is your responsibility to ask for it, from an invigilator.

Consequences



- Removal and malpractice forms, like the real GCSEs, will be filled in by Mrs Lyne-Bennett (invigilator feedback)
- In the real GCSEs, these forms will be sent to the exam board
- They make a decision on disqualification
- Last year, we had 2 malpractice incidents, which resulted in those students losing 40% of their marks for that subject

In the event of a fire alarm


Access Arrangements



- 25% extra time: any work completed in extra time should be done in red pen
- Reader pen: your reading pen will be on the desk
- Human reader: you can ask an invigilator to read questions for you, apart from English Language exams
- Rest breaks: if you are entitled to rest breaks, put your hand up if you need one (NOT in the first or last 15 minutes)
- Scribe: an invigilator will write for you
- Laptop: laptops will be on your desk, set up and ready with a document open

Access Arrangements

- If you have access arrangements (25% extra time, laptop, scribe, reader pen, etc) you will need to sign a form from the invigilators before you leave the hall
- Stay behind until you have done so





The End of the Exam



- Stop writing as soon as the time ends, unless you have extra time
- Papers will be collected in rows
- Examination conditions remain until you are outside of the examination room
- If a mock exam finishes midway through a lesson, you MUST go to the lesson. Wandering around school is not acceptable.
