

### Paper 1

#### Section A - Reading (1 hour)

Students will be given an unseen fiction text which they have to read and answer questions about. It is recommended that students read the reading questions before they read the text as a whole

Students will be tested on the following reading skills:

- Identifying explicit information (listing 4 things they learn from a specific part of the text).
- Language analysis (how a writer uses words and language features for a particular effect).
- Structure analysis (how a writer uses structural devices for a particular effect).
- Evaluation (critically commenting on how successful a writer has been in their writing).

#### Section B - Writing (45 minutes)

Students will be given 2 writing tasks and they choose one to complete. Once task will be descriptive and one task will be narrative.

Students will be marked on the following:

- 1. Style/tone/formality.
- 2. Vocabulary choices and spelling.
- 3. Paragraphing and structure.
- 4. Use of language techniques appropriate to the writing style.
- 5. Punctuation and sentence variety.

### Paper 2

#### Section A - Reading (1 hour)

Students will be given two unseen non-fiction texts which they have to read and answer questions about. It is recommended that students read the reading questions before they read the texts as a whole. One source will be a  $21^{st}$  century source and the other source will be a  $19^{th}$  century source.

Students will be tested on the following reading skills:

- Identifying explicit and implicit information and synthesising the similarities or differences between the two texts (summarising the main points using quotes).
- Language analysis (how a writer uses words and language features for a particular effect).
- Comparing Writers' Ideas and Viewpoints (comparing the views and perspectives of the writer and how they present these ideas).

#### Section B - Writing (45 minutes)

Students will be given a writing task where they have to express their own viewpoint. There is usually a statement and students have to argue for or against this statement.

Students will be marked on the following:

- 1. Style/tone/formality.
- 2. Vocabulary choices and spelling.
- 3. Paragraphing and structure.
- 4. Use of language techniques appropriate to the writing style.
- 5. Punctuation and sentence variety.

#### Paper 1

#### Section A: Shakespeare - Romeo and Juliet

Students have read 'Romeo and Juliet' in lessons in preparation for the examination.

Students will be given an extract from the play and will have to write in detail about the extract and then about the play as a whole. The question is likely to be about a character, a relationship or theme within the play.

#### Section B: The 19th Century Novel - Frankenstein

Students have read 'Frankenstein' in lessons in preparation for the examination. Students will be given an extract from the novel and will have to write in detail about the extract and then about the novel as a whole. The question is likely to be about a character, a relationship or theme within the novel.

## Paper 2

#### Section A: Modern Texts - An Inspector Calls

Students have read 'An Inspector Calls' in lessons in preparation for the examination. Students will answer one essay question from a choice of two. The question is likely to be about a character, a relationship or theme in the play.

#### Section B: Poetry - Power and Conflict

Students have studied a selection of poems from the 'Power and Conflict' poetry anthology.

In the examination, students will answer a comparative question based on one poem that has been printed on the exam paper and another poem of their choice from the anthology. Students will be assessed on their understanding of the themes and ideas in the poems, the poets' use of poetic techniques and the poets' use of structure.

#### Section C: Unseen Poetry analysis

Students will be given two poems printed in the examination paper which they will not have seen before. They will answer one question on one of the poems and one question comparing both of the poems.

### Paper 1

#### Our Natural World:

Students will develop an understanding and appreciation of the natural world they live in and why it looks the way it does. They study the rich diversity of landscapes and ecosystems which are changing through physical processes and human interactions.

There are four topics:

- Global hazards
- Changing climate
- Distinctive landscapes
- Sustaining ecosystems.

The examination is split into two sections:

<u>Section A:</u> Global Hazards, Changing Climate, Distinctive Landscapes and Sustaining Ecosystems – students answer a question on each of these 4 topics we have studied.

<u>Section B:</u> Fieldwork Physical- students will answer questions about their own field work and generic fieldwork skills will be examined in this section.

Fieldwork skills include understanding and applying specific geographical knowledge, understanding and skills to real-world physical geographical contexts.

### Paper 2

#### People and Society:

Students will explore the social, cultural, political and economic forces that make places unique, and how these change over time and space, particularly the growth of urbanisation and the challenges of feeding an ever-growing population.

There are four topics:

Urban futures

- Dynamic development
- UK in the 21st century
- Resource reliance.

The examination paper will be split into two sections:

<u>Section A:</u> Urban Futures, Dynamic Development, UK in the 21st Century and Resource Reliance - students answer a question on each of these 4 topics we have studied.

<u>Section B:</u> Fieldwork Human- students will answer questions about their own field work and generic fieldwork skills will be examined in this section.

Fieldwork skills include understanding and applying specific geographical knowledge, understanding and skills to real-world human geographical contexts

#### Paper 3

This component of the course draws on geographical knowledge, understanding and skills that have been developed in components 01 and 02. This synoptic assessment enables students to demonstrate their understanding of the connections between the different elements of the subject.

Geographical skills:

- Cartographic
- Graphical
- Numerical
- Statistical.

This component includes a decision-making exercise, here students can become critical thinkers and develop arguments.

### Paper 1

#### Section A - Historic environment

Whitechapel 1870-1900, policing and the inner city. Students have studied the key features of this topic and will be asked to describe features of this era. They will be asked to analyse two sources for their usefulness and to follow up sources for an enquiry.

#### Section B - Thematic study Crime and Punishment c1000-present day

Pupils have studied the changing nature of crime, punishment and law enforcement over four eras. Medieval, Early Modern,  $18^{th}$  -  $19^{th}$  century and the  $20^{th}$  century.

They will be asked about change and continuity of crimes, punishment and law enforcement. Students should know key turning points such as the English Civil War.

They will be asked three questions.

- 1. To explain changes and similarities between eras.
- 2. To explain causes of change.
- 3. To analyse the impact of the changes.

### Paper 2

This is assessed in two papers but on the same day at the same time. Students may choose which order they want to answer the topics.

#### Section A - Early Elizabethan England 1558-1588

Students have studied the key features and events of the first half of the Elizabethan era, such as her early problems, changes to religion, challenges and threats to her, the relationship with Spain and the Golden era. They will answer three questions.

Question 1. Describe two features of the Elizabethan reign.

Question 2. Explain why...

This assesses the causes of changes during the era. For example the causes of poverty, the causes of rebellions against the Queen.

Question 3. Students are given a statement to assess how far they agree with the statement. This requires students to give a balanced answer using knowledge for both sides and a justified conclusion.

#### Section B - Superpower relations and the Cold War 1941-91

Students study the key events and chronology of the events and how they are connected. The key points are the origins of the Cold War, the Crises of the Cold War and the End of the Cold War.

Question 1 - Explain two consequences of an event.

Question 2 - Write a narrative analysing key events. Students are required to explain events and how they are connected.

Question 3 - Explain the importance of events. Students are required to analyse how important the events are and their impact on the relations during the Cold War.

### Paper 3

#### Weimar and Nazi Germany 1918-38

Students study the challenges facing the Weimar Republic 1918-29, Hitler's rise to power 1919-33, Nazi control and dictatorship 1933-39, life in Nazi Germany 1933-39

The paper is in two sections:

#### Section A:

- Question 1 Students make an inference on the source.
- Question 2 Students are asked to explain causes of change.

#### Section B:

- Question 3a students are asked to analyse two sources for their usefulness
- Question 3b and c: Students are asked to explain how the two interpretations differ and to suggest why the two interpretations differ.
- Question 3d: Requires students to evaluate one interpretation, making use of the other interpretation and their knowledge of the historical context

- Weekly intervention
- Revision guides/booklets provided on all topics.
- Students can also buy some revision guides and workbooks.
- Paper 1 mock examination was completed in June 2018.
- Paper 2 mock examination to be completed in December 2018.
- Mock paper three will be completed in lesson time once completed.

### Paper 1: Christian Beliefs and Practices

#### Section A: Christian Beliefs

Students need to be able to explain what Christians believe about the nature of God. This includes the beliefs that God is omnipotent, loving and just, and the problem of evil and suffering. They should also be able to explain the oneness of God and the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They need an understanding of different Christian beliefs about creation, including the role of Word and Spirit (John 1:1-3 and Genesis 1:1-3). In addition, students need to be able to explain different Christian beliefs about the afterlife and their importance, including: resurrection and life after death; judgement, heaven and hell. Finally, students need to be able to explain Christian beliefs about Jesus Christ and salvation, including the incarnation and Jesus as the Son of God, the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension, sin, including original sin, the means of salvation, including law, grace and Spirit and the role of Christ in salvation including the idea of atonement.

#### Section B: Christian Practices

Students need to be able to explain different forms of worship and their significance. These include: liturgical, non-liturgical and informal, including the use of the Bible; private worship; prayer and its significance, including the Lord's Prayer, set prayers and informal prayer; the role and meaning of the sacraments: the meaning of sacrament; the sacrament of baptism and its significance for Christians; infant and believers' baptism; different beliefs about infant baptism; the sacrament of Eucharist (Holy Communion) and its significance for Christians, including different ways in which it is celebrated and different interpretations of its meaning; the role and importance of pilgrimage and celebrations including: two contrasting examples of Christian pilgrimage: Lourdes and Iona; the celebrations of Christmas and Easter, including their importance for Christians in Great Britain today. In addition they need to be able to explain the role of the church in the local and worldwide community. This includes: The role of the Church in the local community, including food banks and street pastors; the place of mission, evangelism and Church growth. The importance of the worldwide Church including: working for

reconciliation how Christian churches respond to persecution and the work of one of the following: Catholic Agency For Overseas Development (CAFOD), Christian Aid, Tear fund.

### Paper 1: Muslim Beliefs and Practices

#### Section A: Muslim Beliefs

Students need to be able to explain key Muslim beliefs, including, the six articles of faith in Sunni Islam and five roots of Usul ad-Din in Shi'a Islam, including key similarities and differences. They need to be able to explain the Oneness of God (Tawhid), Qur'an Surah 112 as well as the nature of God: omnipotence, beneficence, mercy, fairness and justice (Adalat in Shi'a Islam), including different ideas about God's relationship with the world: immanence and transcendence. In addition, they need to be able to explain Muslim beliefs in: Angels, their nature and role, including Jibril and Mika'il; predestination and human freedom and its relationship to the Day of Judgement; life after death (Akhirah), human responsibility and accountability, resurrection, heaven and hell. Students also need to be able to explain different forms of Muslim authority including: Prophet hood (Risalah) including the role and importance of Adam, Ibrahim and Muhammad; the holy books: Qur'an: revelation and authority; the Torah, the Psalms, the Gospel, the Scrolls of Abraham and their authority and finally the imamate in Shi'a Islam: its role and significance.

#### Section B: Muslim Practices

Students need to able to explain contrasting ways in which Muslims worship. These include: the Five Pillars of Sunni Islam and the Ten Obligatory Acts of Shi'a Islam (students should study the Five Pillars and jihad in both Sunni and Shi'a Islam and the additional duties of Shi'a Islam); Shahadah: declaration of faith and its place in Muslim practice; Salah and its significance: how and why Muslims pray including times, directions, ablution (wudu), movements (rak'ahs) and recitations; salah in the home and mosque and elsewhere; Friday prayer (Jummah); key differences in the practice of salah in Sunni and Shi'a Islam, and different Muslim views about the importance of prayer. In addition students need to able to explain various Muslim duties and festivals including: Sawm: the role and significance of fasting during the month of Ramadan including origins, duties, benefits of fasting, the exceptions and their reasons, and the Night of Power, Qur'an 96:1-5; Zakah: the role and significance of giving alms including origins, how and why it is given, benefits of receipt, Khums in Shi'a Islam; Hajj: the role and significance of the pilgrimage to Makkah including origins, how hajj is performed,

the actions pilgrims perform at sites including the Ka'aba at Makkah, Mina, Arafat, Muzdalifah and their significance; *Jihad: different understandings of jihad*: the meaning and significance of greater and lesser jihad; origins, influence and conditions for the declaration of lesser jihad and finally, *festivals and commemorations* and their importance for Muslims in Great Britain today, including the origins and meanings of *Id-ul-Adha*, *Id-ul-Fitr*, *Ashura*.

## Paper 2: Thematic Studies EXCLUDING Textual Studies

Students study four of six themes from a Christian and Muslim perspective, as well as looking at contemporary attitudes within Great Britain. The themes that we study are:

Theme A: Relationships and Families

Theme B: Religion and Life.

Theme C: Existence of God and Revelation Theme E: Religion, Crime and Punishment

Students must answer the questions on each of these sections. They will be tested on their knowledge of key words as well as being able to explain contrasting religious views on the themes studied. Students need to be familiar with relevant religious teachings and be able to relate these to the themes, particularly within the 5 and 12 mark questions.

Students will then demonstrate and be assessed on their practical skills.

### Unit 1 - Practical Sports Performance

Students will study and be assessed one individual sport and one team sport. They will also study the rules and regulations of each sport and the roles of officials. Students will learn how to review their own sports performance in terms of strengths and weaknesses.

Assessment task to include: log books detailing skills and tactics learned, practical performances, power point presentations on rules and regulations in each sport as well as a written/typed review of own performances in both sports.

NB: This unit has already been completed and assessed

## Unit 2 - Fitness for Sport and Exercise

Students will study the different health and skill related components of fitness and their importance for different sports, as well as how to assess each through fitness testing. They will also learn about the principles of training and different methods of training

Assessment: 1hr onscreen externally assessed exam worth 50 marks. Resits are available as required.

### Unit 3 - Mind and Sports Performance

Students will learn about different types of personality, motivation, arousal and anxiety; the theories behind each and how performance can be affected.

Assessment tasks to include: Written/typed reports which requires students to describe and explain these psychological factors using practical examples from sport.

### <u>Unit 6 - Leading Sports Activities</u>

Students will learn about different leadership qualities in sport and the factors which need to be considered when planning an effective activity session. Students will be required to plan and lead a session for other students and then evaluate the effectiveness of the session and their own leadership skills.

Assessments tasks to include: Written/typed report, creation of a session plan, filmed evidence of students leading the session followed by a written/typed review.

#### Additional Information

Unit 1 and 2 are core units which means the grades achieved in these two units will determine if a student can achieve the equivalent of a level 2 qualification overall (Pass, Merit, Distinction) or a level 1 Pass overall.

Commercialisation and Sponsorship, Ethics, Feedback, Goal setting, Diet & Nutrition, Benefits of and Barriers to Participation etc.

### Additional Information

Students will be required to answer questions that vary in length from 1-6 marks. These may be a combination of the following type of questions: identify, describe, explain, compare, analyse or evaluate. There will also be a synoptic question where students will be judged on the quality of their written communication (QWC) and will be required to draw on learning from both exam units. It is also essential that students include clear and relevant practical examples from physical activity and sport to support their answers.

Students are currently completing their written non-examined assessment 'Analysing and Evaluating Performance' (AEP) which forms part of the component 3 and is worth 10% of the final marks. This is a 14 hour task that requires students to independently assess their strengths and weaknesses in one physical activity and create an action plan to address an identified weakness. It is essential that students meet deadlines set for each task and answer in as much detail as possible to achieve the highest marks.

Practical assessments are ongoing and therefore participation in sport in and out of school is imperative. Students must complete a 'competitive log' which details when they have competed and the outcome of the event. OCR requires these logs to be handed in during the moderation which takes place in May. During this moderation, selected students are asked to participate in the activities chosen by the exam board to check the accuracy of the marks we have provided. Please be aware we do not have any control over which students are selected and that it is **mandatory** they participate.
