### **Examination results 2019**

Students achieved excellent examination results again this year with 76% of students achieving a grade 4 or above in **both** English and Mathematics. This is way above the national average. I am extremely proud of our students' achievements and would like to thank our dedicated staff for all they do. Of course, it goes without saying that our students couldn't succeed without the support of parents and carers and I thank you all for your continued support.
