"The best Book Week in my time at Aldermaston!" Year 6 pupil

In numbers....

- 37 people came to the costume swap on World Book Day
- We gave out more than 160 book caching passports
- 30 book caches have made it back to the library in one piece!
- 78 people came to Storytelling Evening
- 16 staff/volunteers read a story as the Masked Reader
- We made enough afternoon tea for 140 people
- We were featured in two newspapers (the Penny Post and the Newbury Weekly News)

We raised £192 at the Book and Doughnut Sale!

The children:

Feedback from the children was overwhelmingly positive across the school. They said how exciting it is to have a curriculum week and how much they love it when their teachers get stuck in to the activities. They love doing practical activities and they love involving their families in their learning. Their favourite events were dressing up day; the Masked Reader; book caching and cooking in school.

"Book Caching was amazing – the children were so excited to read the books."


"The infectious energy it creates around school is so enjoyable!"
