Welcome to Autumn Term (2). You should have received your curriculum overview for this term and hopefully you are already hearing from your children about their new topics in class.

This term, our value for Collective Worships is 'Courage' and we will be exploring what this means through bible stories, current events and wider school life. In every class, children are trying to follow the example of our Thinker Learning Hero who solves problems by using a creative and imaginative approach.



Anti-bullying week

The theme of anti-bullying week is 'Choose Respect'. It focuses on the power we all have as individuals (children and adults) to make positive choices to help others and prevent, address and resolve bullying situations through respectful and kind behaviour. A key theme is children asking the adults in their lives to lead by example, both online and offline.

As always, we are committed to taking part in this annual event. It allows us to revisit our school definition of bullying and ensure children know how to get help if they witness or are subject to bullying behaviour.

Our approach to bullying is linked to our expectations that everyone in the school should feel **safe**, **happy and able to learn**.

Bullying is a type of anti-social behaviour which is repetitive, intentional and involves an imbalance of power.

We want every child to be able to tell a trusted adult if they come across this type of behaviour.

The School Council has some work planned around this topic. We will also be talking to all children about having courage to stop bullying in a whole school collective worship as well as finding out what learning they have completed in class to help keep everyone safe.

Bikeability



In another example of our safety curriculum, children in Year 5 and Year 6 enjoyed the chance to complete their Level 1, Bikeability training in school. Being able to ride a bike is such a great skill for children. It gives them access to a healthy active pastime, allows them to explore further afield and can make travel easier. Bikeability training gives them the skills to be safe and confident on our roads. Well done to all who took part.

Penalty Notice Fines for absence from school are changing

From 19th August 2024 Penalty Notice fines increase to £160 for each parent, for each child.













- being late after the register has closed
- truancy
- taking a holiday without permission from the school
- or if a headteacher isn't satisfied for the reason for missing school

Over a rolling 3-year period the sanctions are:

- 1st offence £160 reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days
- · 2nd offence £160
- 3rd offence Court hearing and up to £2,500 fine, or up to 3 months in prison and a criminal record

Attendance update:

Working together to improve School Attendance 2024 (WTTISA 2024) became statutory guidance on 19 August 2024. As a school we are guided by this statutory paperwork and have to follow the guidelines and thresholds set out in this document. The guidelines and thresholds are applied nationally for state maintained schools.

For example, the national threshold for when a penalty notice must be *considered* is when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-week period.

When the national threshold is met, schools are required to make an assessment on a case-by-case basis whether a penalty notice is the appropriate tool. This does not include holidays during term time

In regards to holidays during term time, leave of absence forms need to be completed and shared with the office. These will be reviewed, considered on a case-by-case basis and as a school we will share the outcome. If the holiday request meet or exceeds 5 days (10 sessions), it is likely to be referred to West Berks for a potential penalty notice.

We have a responsibility to provide a safe learning environment for everyone in our school and we take the management of allergies very seriously.

Our insurance only covers the use of this equipment with supervision by staff, who are trained in the correct use of the play equipment and we would not want any harm to come to the children without the correct supervision.
