It was a great boost to self-esteem and confidence, tied in with the school approach to oracy and came at a fantastic time to help them get ready for the KS2 Summer Production.

This week, we have had not one, but two inspiring concerts. On Monday afternoon, we enjoyed performances from Willink pupils who are studying for a music GSCE. These children were a credit to their school and opened our eyes to the possibility of pursuing a passion for singing or playing an instrument at secondary school as part of the curriculum. Mrs Waugh also organised a woodwind performance from Berkshire Music Trust musicians who showcased their skills on a range of instruments including flutes, oboes, clarinets and saxophones. The Kingfishers Class were lucky enough to stay on after the concert to have a go at playing some different instruments and hopefully to consider taking up a new hobby!
