Notice of Road Closure

We have been advised by the Parish Council that Wasing Lane will be closed just past the school's main entrance to the footpath access (Public Right of Way) further down Wasing Lane on the left about 100 yards.

West Berkshire Council's term maintenance contractor Volker Highways Ltd., will shortly be constructing a
new footpath from the eastern end of Wasing Lane (near Forsters) to the public right of way footpath west
of Aldermaston.

Work is scheduled to start on **Monday 5th July 2021 and take up to 10 working days to complete**. In order to protect both the work force undertaking these improvements and the public a full road closure will be in place from

Aldermaston Primary School to the PROW. The closure will be in place **24 hours a day from the 5th July until**

afternoon of the 12th July. It will then be put up and removed each day (between 8am and 5pm) from the
13th July until the 16th July. A signed diversion route will be in place whilst the road closure is
operational.

Access to residential dwellings within the closure area and emergency vehicles on a blue light will be permitted at all times.

Covid 19 - Staying Safe

It's important that we continue to keep our community safe from Covid 19. DfE advice to schools has not changed and we are required to continue with our current safety arrangements.

When on our school site, please remember to:-

Wear face coverings (unless you are exempt)

Keep a safe distance from others on the school site and supervise children carefully

For the time being, we are asking children not to bring unnecessary items in from home.

If you are having to isolate for any reason, please do not come to school site. If this causes any concern for collection and drop off please speak to the school office.

Lastly, we would welcome any feedback on how we could make our newsletter more relevant or interesting and/or other ways you think we could improve communications and community involvement.









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
