Covid 19 update

We are aware that there has been a significant spike in confirmed cases of Covid 19 in West Berkshire. We are carefully monitoring the situation at our school and if we experience a rise in cases, we will put in place our contingency plans. For the time being, we are planning ahead as if nativity performances, open mornings, etc for next term will happen in person. We will let you know as soon as possible about any changes we have to make to arrangements going forward. Thank you for your help this term in letting us know about potential cases and being so considerate in your approach to testing when needed.

Election frenzy

Our classrooms have been awash with democracy this week as some very worthy candidates put themselves forward as School Council representatives. Teachers have used School Council elections as an opportunity to revisit the British value of democracy with our children and to discuss the importance of elections.

Our School Council gives the children a voice in how we run the school and, over the years, School Councils have made a real impact on lots of different areas of school life including break and lunchtimes and updating our school Learning Heroes.

Candidates were told that they would need to:-

- Attend School Council meetings.
- Discuss ideas to improve our school with other School Council members.
- Talk with the rest of their class and report back on everyone's thoughts and ideas.
- Be prepared to make presentations in assembly or explain their work to visitors like our school governors.

We asked candidates to show that they had particular qualities too.

- They should care about our school and want to make it the best school for everyone in our community.
- They needed great listening skills and the confidence to communicate their ideas and speak in front of others.
- They should be well organised and work well with others in a team.

All candidates made speeches to their classes about why they should be elected before a class vote was held to select the class representatives. We are so proud of every child who put their name forward for the School Council. Standing up in front of your class is a brave thing and I know the courage it took for many of our children to give election speeches. It's great to have so many children who want to do their bit and give back to the school.


