#### An Icky Doo Dah Day

Thank you so much to local author Simon Murray for visiting our school yesterday and sharing his talents with our Wrens, Robins and Owls classes.

Simon is the author of 'Icky Doo Dah' - recently read at Reading Café (you can find the video on our reading blog on the school website). His books are full of Icky Doo Dah's adventures with lots of fun illustrations. You can see the children in Wrens Class were completely transfixed by Simon's visit and they really enjoyed finding out the secrets of drawing story characters. Across the school, we now have lots of personalised Icky Doo Dah sketches to enjoy.



Thank you for sending in such lovely comments about how much your

children enjoyed this event. It's always useful for us to have feedback about the events that children particularly enjoy in school. Let's hope we've inspired another generation of writers and illustrators and have encouraged children to try some new books to read over the half term break. Thank you to Mrs Ebrey for arranging this visit and for all of her work preparing for our annual book week at the start of next term.



#### Staying safe online

We all know that our children enjoy gaming during their spare time. It can be a great way for them to develop a whole host of skills and enjoy a shared interest with their friends. But we worry about their safety online and how we can take care of their wellbeing.

The theme of safer internet day 2022 was 'All fun and games?' and it encouraged us to think about how children show respect and manage relationships whilst enjoying their time using devices and playing with others through the internet. It's always worth having conversations with your children about the games and websites they are currently playing, why they enjoy them and who they're playing with when they are online.

Every class in the school completed some tailored work on internet safety on safer internet day. Here are some examples of the type of work completed.

Starlings Class demonstrated their excellent knowledge of staying safe online during their internet safety lessons. They have a good understanding of our children's code of conduct and why we have such expectations of how ICT tools are used for learning. With our older children, we often deliver additional lessons in class in response to concerns raised by parents about activities outside of school. We're happy to help support keeping our children safe. Starlings have completed extra

work on consent for sharing information and images and how to manage 'chats' on social media when the behavior of others causes them concern.

Wrens Class were able to use an excellent picture book to explore staying safe online in an age appropriate way. Reading 'Chicken Clicking' helped the children understand that people online aren't always who we think they are. In the story it was actually a fox who was pretending to be the chicken's friend! They also talked about how you needed to ask a person's permission to take their photo, as they may not want to do it or for it to be shared with other people. There were lots of excellent discussions!

On the Friday, our whole school assembly was led by our Year 6 'Tech Team' who championed internet safety with their peers. Harry, Jack, Jacob, Jake, Grace and Taylor gave up lots of their spare time to prepare really informative slides about staying safe and answered some challenging questions from their audience. It makes a huge difference to the children in our school to have this information shared by older children as well as by adults and to know there's someone else they can talk to in school if they're worried. We're very proud of our Tech Team!

#### Some unexpected weddings

Reverend Jane has been officiating at some unusual wedding ceremonies in school. As part of their curriculum, children in Wrens Class have been told the story of the first miracle that Jesus performed at a wedding, where he turned water into wine. The children were really interested in finding out about weddings, particularly as not many of them had been to one. We watched some videos from different faiths including Christian and Hindu. We made tissue paper flowers for bouquets and set up the classroom for a ceremony, making sure that there was an aisle between the seats for the guests. On her visit the following week, we performed a wedding ceremony for Reverend Jane and shared all the facts that we had learned about them. It was so much fun that we have been role playing it all week, taking turns to play different parts and practise our oracy skills.



#### Covid update

Just a brief note to reassure that levels of Covid in our school community have now dropped significantly. We currently have no confirmed cases which is a lovely position to be in as we start the half term break. We are all expecting an update from the government on Covid measures over the next week and the local authority have set a meeting for schools at the start of next term to update us on changing expectations and requirements.

#### Goodbye and Thank you

Today, we say goodbye to Glenn, our site controller of just over 9 years. Glenn who has been an invaluable member of the Aldermaston Team has decided to fully retire to be able to travel and spend time with his family. Thank you, Glenn for all that you have done over the years.

A huge thank you to all of our staff for their work this term. Covid has made this term incredibly challenging and we have experienced significant staff shortages. Their willingness to go the extra mile, usually at the expense of their own work life balance, has allowed us to keep all classes open and to continue delivering our school curriculum as planned.

We look forward to welcoming all our children back on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

#### **Maths Curriculum**

Needing support and help in Maths in KS1? White Rose, who we use as a basis for our Maths curriculum, have produced a new interactive product that is free to download. It is called 1 - Minute Maths. White Rose Maths state; "our new 1-Minute Maths app helps children build greater number confidence and fluency. It's all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks!"

It is aimed at KS1, but FS could access it also. The app focuses on the development of key skills: subitising (instant recognition of numbers and number of objects) and addition and subtraction.
