#### Family Learning Morning

Thank you so much for joining in with our family learning morning. The children and staff loved having so many visitors in the classroom (fifty six in total). Everyone was impressed by the skills you brought to the lessons too!

There really is nothing to compare to sitting alongside your children in lessons, meeting the staff who work with them and getting a better understanding of the classroom routines and their learning environment. We hope that these events also show you how we are addressing key areas of school improvement and policy.

The feedback you provided was lovely and also really useful, thank you. It has been shared with all staff in the school. One suggestion made, which we think is great, was to invite parents and family members to talk to our older children about possible future careers. We're looking at the school diary to find a good slot for this. #### Mental Health Support Team

Last week, the mental health support team led our parent drop in session on Tuesday and also two assemblies - for Years 3 and 4 and Years 5 and 6 - on Friday. All were very well received.

To be clear, the work of this team and of the school in this area is not targeted just at children and adults who have had difficulties with their mental health. In fact, their work is for everyone. It's aimed at ensuring we all know how to protect our wellbeing. We want our children to leave here with a good understanding of the things they can control which help them to feel happy and well.

The mental health support team is officially launching in September. We are hoping that they will be able to hold some parent and carer workshops about areas of wellbeing and mental health which are important to you. Current suggestions include supporting children with worries and anxiety, how to help low mood and top tips for wellbeing. If you have any other suggestions, please drop us an e-mail or catch me on the playground so I can pass them on to the team. I cannot emphasise enough how lucky we are to have access to this team of professionals and how useful it is to work with children before concerns about their wellbeing become embedded difficulties.

#### Uniform and PE Kits

We have a uniform to ensure children feel a sense of belonging in our school community, are smart and ready to learn and don't find themselves competing or comparing with others over clothes or fashion sense. Please support children in wearing the correct uniform and ensure they are not bringing in items of jewellery or accessories which they may also risk losing at school. We have noticed an increasing number of children who are also forgetting to bring in their PE kits. PE kits should be in school on Monday morning, even if they have been taken home for a wash on Friday. PE is a statutory entitlement and children definitely need the correct footwear to take part safely in outdoor PE lessons.

We are able to help families who find it difficult to meet the financial costs of uniform. Please don't feel worried about talking to me, your child's teacher or letting office staff know if you need any help. Finances are tricky for many families at the moment and we want all our children to feel comfortable at school.

Mrs Makepeace and I enjoyed spending time with the families of our new entrants, who will be joining us in September, when they attended the parent information event this week. Our (soon to be) new Wrens are a lovely group of children who will visiting their classroom for a stay and play session next week.
