We are starting this term looking at the value of 'Courage'. #### **Attendance**

For Autumn Term (1), whole school attendance was 94.4%. Our school target is 96%. Along with other local schools (and I suspect this is a national trend), we've noted a rise in requests for children to take holidays in term time.

In September this year, the DfE published new guidance for 'improving school attendance'. We have reflected this guidance in our school attendance policy which is available on our website and we are sending it out with this newsletter.

I know that we've had a couple of very unsettled years with lots of additional pressures on family life. However, there's a very clear link between children's academic success and their attendance. Looking at it from a mental health and wellbeing viewpoint, children attending school every day develop confidence and resilience and feel secure in their friendships and the relationships they have with adults at the school. For a worried or anxious child, being absent for key lessons in a unit of work or missing out on fun activities with their friends can make things even more difficult. Learning at school is progressive and each lesson builds on the lessons from the previous day. It becomes increasingly difficult for children to 'catch up' on missed learning and for many, over time, poor attendance can cause significant damage to their education and future life chances.

We monitor attendance figures every half term. If your child's attendance has dropped below 90%, they are classed as a persistent absentee. We will write to let you know that we are concerned about their low attendance and that we may no longer authorise further absences without evidence to support the reason given for each absence. We have termly meetings with the local authority Education Welfare Officer to discuss attendance of children who are persistent absentees and to review whether we can see improvements to their attendance following receipt of an attendance letter.

If there is anything we can do to help a child to overcome barriers to attendance, please let us know. We can put in place personalised support for a child who is having difficulties and look at making referrals for support from external agencies where that would be helpful.

#### Children leading the way!

It's only the first week back and our pupil leadership teams are hard at work. The House Captains and Deputy House Captains are very proud to be collecting donations for poppies and other Royal British Legion remembrance items to raise money for their Poppy Appeal. You can also see the School Council hard at work on a litter pick which was one of the first suggestions of our newly elected representatives.



I hope you enjoy any bonfire night celebrations you are attending. I understand that the Aldermaston PTA run event at Padworth on this Sunday is going to be particularly amazing and should not be missed! Wishing you all a lovely weekend.

## **NO NUTS STATEMENT**

We have a responsibility to provide a safe learning environment for everyone in our school and we take the management of allergies very seriously.

#### NO Smoking on School Grounds

Our school site is a no smoking zone and we therefore ask all parents to NOT smoke within the school grounds. Thank you.

#### Car Park

Please be considerate when parking in our school grounds to drop off and collect your child. The spaces on the left hand side of the drive are meant to be used for people who can drop off or pick their child/children up quickly, rather than for those needing to wait for a long time. If you need to wait, please park in the spaces to the right of the main drive or in the spaces in front of the field to the left of the main school building as you come into the entrance gate. Thank you.

#### **Use of Playground Equipment**

We would ask that **NO CHILDREN** are allowed to play on the school equipment in and around the playground. These areas are for use by the children during school time only and should **NOT BE USED** by children before school or after school. Our insurance only covers the use of this equipment with supervision by staff, who are trained in the correct use of the play equipment and we would not want any harm to come to the children without the correct supervision.
