Attendance

Our school attendance target is 96% and for Autumn Term (1) our average attendance has been 94.7%. Whilst there are genuinely some nasty bugs doing the rounds at this time of year, and we do not want children to feel unwell at school or to pass around illness, there are also too many avoidable lost days of learning. There is a direct link between learning outcomes and attendance at school. This means that if your child misses lessons at school, they are less likely to reach the expected standard for their age group.

The Department for Education and the local authority are very clear about the need to improve school attendance figures. As a result, we will now be amending our attendance policy to include provision for fining families whose children have unauthorised absences of 5 days or more. Typically, this will be when families choose to take their children on holiday during term time. We will share the updated policy with you after half term. We will also continue to send termly letters to families when their child's low attendance is causing concern.

Sponsored success

What a great outcome from Nerys Pearce's visit! Not only did we meet an inspirational sportswoman but our children have raised just over £800 to spend on sports equipment. I know our school council will be up to the challenge of helping us choose some new equipment. Thank you all for your support.

Welcoming visitors

It has been a very busy term for welcoming lots of people into school. We had a good turnout for our first Open Morning and felt very proud sharing the school with prospective parents for next September. Our children are such a fantastic advert for Aldermaston School.

Thank you for making the time to attend our recent parent evenings. Our teachers enjoyed showing you how well your children have settled to their learning this year. Don't forget, we are always happy to talk with you about how your child is getting on. You don't need to wait for parents' evening or written reports if you have any concerns or questions. Class teachers are available daily for a quick chat at the end of the day and you can make an appointment to speak with them through the school office as needed.

Our Wrens parents enjoyed their first curriculum coffee morning recently. Mrs Makepeace shared our approach to teaching early reading and provided phonics packs to support families in sharing their children's learning at home.

Road Safety

Over the last couple of weeks, our road safety lessons have been a really useful reminder about how we can keep ourselves safe when out and about. I hope you see the children applying their learning on family trips and outings over the half term break. Everything from being visible, understanding stopping distances and the challenges of hearing electric cars have been discussed and considered and it was great to see practical sessions in our school car park helping the children to understand safely crossing roads.
