School Dinners

We're very happy with the service and the quality of food being provided by PS Catering. Unfortunately, due to rising food costs and staffing expenses, the company is struggling to break even in their contract with us. In the current financial climate, catering for small schools is just not profitable for companies.

We recently met with PS Catering and representatives of Brimpton, our partner school in this contract, to explore options for managing costs and supporting the continuation of this service through the next academic year. As a result, we will be reducing menu options to two choices. We've looked at which dishes are most popular with the children and have revamped the school dinner menu from September. This will be a change from the published menu which was originally due to change in October. We are also increasing the cost of school dinners to £3.00 per meal from the beginning of the Autumn Term. Even with these changes, we ideally need a few more children to regularly buy school dinners.

We believe it is important to be able to offer a delicious and nutritious hot lunch option for all children in the school.

End of term service

Yesterday, our end of term service was beautifully led by Kingfishers Class at St Mary's Church. The theme was change and moving on to new classes, or for Year 6, new schools. The music and readings were lovely and we were so impressed with the maturity and oracy skills of the children who gave the readings. Thanks to the Church for the gift of a bible each for every child moving to secondary school in September.
