Those of you who use Playzone will be aware that they have been trying to recruit a chairperson this year. The committee, which is made up of volunteers and includes parents from both the Cedars and Aldermaston School, considered their decision very carefully. We are hugely indebted to Angie Garland and her team along with all the parents and volunteers who have generously served on the committee over the years it has been in operation. We know that many of our children have enjoyed their time at Playzone and will have lots of happy Playzone memories.

As a school, we are committed to ensuring access to high quality wraparound care. We understand how important this is – that's why we stepped in to provide Larks Club when Playzone were unable to continue their breakfast club during recent times. We are working hard behind the scenes to get things in place for September. We are not yet in a position to confirm new arrangements but hope to do so as soon as possible.

Catch Up Premium

I am sure you are aware that the government has allocated some extra money to schools this year to help support children to recover from the effects of the pandemic. We are using this money in a range of different ways to benefit all of our children and to target more specific groups and individuals with tailored support in particular areas. Examples of extra provision to date include small group and one to one mathematics tuition and extra phonics teaching. We also recognise that how children are feeling day to day and their wellbeing may have been affected by this difficult time. We are able to use our qualified ELSA (emotional literacy support assistant) and external services to offer support as required. If you have any concerns about your child, please do discuss these with their class teacher.
