Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you so much for the generous donations to date for our Harvest Festival appeal for the West Berkshire Food Bank. There's still time to add items and the box will remain outside the office during next week too.

### A cold wind...

has been blowing through the media this week with tales of schools risking hypothermia in order to reduce the risks of Covid. I've certainly noticed the seasonal change in temperature on gate duty and wanted to reassure you that we have no intention of subjecting children and staff to icy conditions in our classrooms.


The official advice is that we have to balance the need to have fresh air in the room with thermal comfort. We don't need to have all the windows and doors in a classroom wide open but neither can we have them all shut. We will keep as many windows open as we can (the amount open will depend on the weather outside) to allow ventilation during lessons. At break times, we will open the doors and ventilate the room before closing them during lessons.

It is worth noting that rooms are going to be colder than we are used to so please ensure children have their jumpers every day. It will be worth considering, as the temperatures drop, whether your child would benefit from wearing a thermal vest or similar underneath their school uniform.

### Leading by example

Our fantastic House Captains and Deputy House Captains have refused to be beaten by the class bubble restrictions. They are creating videos to be shared with their fellow house team members in class. These will allow them to share house point scores and inspire great learning in their house teams. Well done Mieke, Charlotte, Thea, Lola-May, Bertie, Dylan, Bella and Vlada.





If your child needs to miss school time as a result of the Covid 19 isolation requirements, even for a day or two, there is work available on our website under the home learning section for each class. Any work completed can be e-mailed in for feedback through our <u>enquiries@aldermaston.w-berks.sch.uk</u>. Of course, there is no expectation that a child who is feeling unwell should complete work and any child absent from school due to illness is not expected to complete this work.

Behind the scenes, we are continuing with preparations to deliver learning at home in the event of a local or national lockdown. Following on from your feedback, and reflecting changes to safeguarding guidance, we should be able to provide each child with regular video contact with their class teachers and the opportunity to directly contact staff themselves during the school day to support them in completing learning tasks. We have registered with G Suite for Education and staff are currently training in the use of google classrooms. Over the next few weeks, we will start to

use this platform with classes during lessons to help familiarise children with how to access and complete work and communicate with teachers in their virtual classroom.

To help us, we'd be really grateful if you could complete and return the technology survey which will be e-mailed to families tomorrow so that we have an accurate view of what devices are available for children's use at home. Many thanks.

#### **Parents' Evening Appointment**

We hope you found your parents' evening appointments helpful and informative. If you were not able to make an appointment for the Tuesday or Wednesday this week, we will be in touch to see if we can find an alternative time for you. We would really like every family to have the opportunity to talk to their child's class teacher.

### Health and safety visit

This week we welcomed the local authority health and safety team who visited our school site. They observed morning drop off routines and conducted a walk through of the school building to observe how class bubbles were organised and other Covid-19 risk reduction measures. It was a really positive experience and it was great to receive external assurance that there are no concerns about the measures we have implemented.
