

Writing is assessed primarily in English but pieces from other subjects may also be used to help confirm judgements eg diary entries written in RE, reports written in History.





#### Mathematics




- One 30 minute arithmetic paper, Paper 1 (36 questions, 40 marks)
- Two reasoning papers, Paper 2 and Paper 3, each lasting 40 minutes.
   (35 marks each)
- Children's marks from all three tests are aggregated to calculate their overall mathematics score out of 110.




