Dear Parent/ Carer,

I hope that all families had an enjoyable break. It was a busy final week of the Spring term with the topic celebrations and the Foundation Stage Easter performance taking place.

Tomorrow, we have a parent presentation on the forthcoming Y6 SATS that are due to take place on the week beginning 13th May. During next week, you should receive a copy of the team newsletter and details about what your child will be learning this term.

Attendance Update

Towards the end of last term, we noticed a downward trend in attendance, mainly down to illness. However, there was also a significant increase in the amount of leave of absence requests received in the final few weeks of last term. The attendance yesterday was also down at 90% and today, it is 92%. It is appreciated that the costs of flights are significantly more expensive in the holiday period, but please could attendance at school be prioritised. The overall school attendance is now close to the national average and places us at the 51st percentile of schools. There is also considerable variation between year groups. For example, attendance in Y2 is within the top 15% of schools, whilst attendance in Y6 is in the bottom 30%. Please see a table below for each year group with the average for the year so far compared to the percentile rank nationally for that particular year group:

A special mention to the children and families in Beech Class, who have the overall highest attendance (96.3%) so far this year. Well done also to the children and families in both Ash and Sycamore, who have the joint second highest levels of attendance (95.8%).

To further understand what levels of attendance look like at Aldryngton, I am including the table below from our Attendance Policy:

For comparison, your child's attendance level up until the end of last term can be found on the Spring term report that was sent out on the last day of term.

Our overall target for attendance is 97%, which factors in time that children may be ill. Your child should be kept at home if they have a high temperature (until it goes away) and sickness/ diarrhoea symptoms (minimum of 48 hours). Pupil Survey Feedback

Last term we were able to finish surveying all of the children in Key Stage 2 about their thoughts of school. The survey consisted of some statements about school that the children had to respond to, alongside some open-ended questions to gather feedback. Children were also asked about the subjects they enjoyed and didn't enjoy. They were also asked about their thoughts on the competitions that take place at the school. This was the first time that the children had completed this survey and the purpose of the survey was to ensure that we have the pupil's voice in both our self-evaluation and improvement priorities moving forward.

The response to the statements was very positive with almost all areas above 90%. For example: 94% of children surveyed enjoyed school, with 97% enjoying learning. 98% felt that school encourages me to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally and 96% felt that they could take part in activities outside of lessons, like clubs, sport, music and art.

Some children felt that the work could be more challenging at times. As a response to this, the school is currently investigating the possibility of partnering with Nace for next academic year.

Top responses for what the children enjoyed best about school were playing with friends, teachers and learning. Children would most like to improve school dinners and have longer playtimes.

Practical subjects e.g. Design and Technology, Art and Physical Education were the most popular. These were closely followed by English and Mathematics. Religious Education was the least popular subject, so we will be looking at options about how this could be improved further for the children in the future.

Children were asked their thoughts about whether the competitions that the school currently offers should continue as yearly competitions, made every other year or scrapped. The large majority of children wanted all of the competitions currently offered to be kept as yearly competitions.

The leadership team found the pupil survey very useful to gather feedback directly from the children and also useful to follow up with particular children where required.
