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

Dear Parent/ Carer,

It is great that the weather has improved once gain and we have been really pleased with how well all the children have started this academic year. I am sure that last weekend, the children would have slept well after their first full week back. At this point of term, I have a couple of reminders for as well as a few updates.

A reminder that it is National Fitness Day tomorrow, so children can come into school wearing their P.E. kits all day. Please could I also remind you to check the events update section at the end of the weekly update as there are a couple of updates to events already.



First of all, it is absolutely great that there are so many bikes and scooters coming into school and long may that continue. It is however, causing a couple of storage issues for us in the interim. Longer term, we are looking at options to make better use of the existing area outside the front office. We also have a unique site in which we have children leaving/ entering in multiple locations, so there will be options presented below where you can choose what is the most convenient area for you to store the bike. Please find a summary below of where you can store your bike/ scooter at the school:

- Foundation Stage only to store their bike/ scooter behind the Foundation Stage garden area, outside Cedar Class.
- Middle School scooters only can now be stored against the fence and outside wall of Beech Class.
- All other bikes or scooters can be stored at the most convenient location, either in the fenced area
 outside the office or on the grassed area between the path and the fencing opposite the play
 equipment. This area offers the largest capacity and also usually has the most space.

Homework Policy

You may recall in the Summer term, we asked for feedback from families about homework. We also asked staff and the children about their thoughts regarding homework. We used this information to update our homework policy and that is now on the policies page on the school website. As I mentioned at the time, it would be possible to get a policy that fits everyone's personal viewpoints as there was and always will be variation in what people think the right amount of homework is.

The general consensus amongst staff, children and parents was that the amount of homework set was about right. Therefore, we made minimal changes to the existing policy. When I spoke to children, many mentioned that they would like some options to complete their homework online as well as some paper-based homework. Parents also mentioned that they would like more feedback regarding the homework provided. Therefore, we had decided to trial MyMaths for one month in year groups 1 to 4 in the first instance. The homework tasks now align with what the children have been covering in class that week for mathematics. There is also a tutorial that can be used if your child needs additional support and it also offers instant feedback, which is then sent to your child's teacher. For those of you, that would like your child to complete more homework, there is also functionality within the system to do this. As a parent, you will be able to see exactly what is covered over each National Curriculum year group. If we do decide to use this system beyond the one-month trial period, we will arrange a workshop for parents to view the full functionality that the programme offers. In the next week or so, if your child is in Y1 to Y4, then they should come home with their log in details for MyMaths.

















Leave of Absence Forms

A reminder that the timeline to process these from submission to the office is five days. Often we are able to respond quicker than this, but once submitted, they have been received and you will hear back in due course. Ideally, for planned absences, we would like notice of at least a month, but we also understand that there can be unplanned emergencies.

Birthday Celebrations in School

We will be continuing with our approach to celebrate a child's birthday by allowing them to wear clothes of their choice on that day. Where the birthday falls at a weekend or during a school holiday, then your child will be able to wear their own clothes on the day closest to their birthday.

A reminder that we will not be handing out any sweets/cake that is brought in from home.

National Fitness Day: Wednesday 18th September

Children will be completing additional physical exercises throughout the day to celebrate this event next week. Therefore, children should enter school and stay in their P.E. kit for the entire day.

60th Anniversary Welcome Picnic: Friday 20th September (3:15pm-4:15pm)

We will be keeping the grounds open for an hour after school on Friday 20th September. This will be an ideal opportunity for the school community to come together and celebrate the start of Aldryngton's 60th year.

Please bring your own snacks and drinks if you wish to do so. The playground and field will be open to all of those that wish to use it. School staff and the PTA will set up stalls near the hall, where families are welcome to come for a chat. It will also be an opportunity to find out about some of the PTA events and how you could be involved.

In the event of bad weather, we will move the staff and PTA stalls into the hall, so that people still have the opportunity to meet and chat regardless of the weather.
