Last week was rather busy. We had our first trips of the year when Upper School visited Rushall Farm as part of their geography learning this term. Finally, on Saturday, a huge thank you to all of the volunteers for helping to further improve the school grounds.

October Census Day: Thursday 3rd October

This day is used to generate the funding levels provided by the government to fund the school for Universal Infant Free School Meals. Therefore, the higher the take up on this particular day, then the more funding the school will receive. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

There has been a menu change this week on Thursday and Friday so please make sure you check your selection if you have already pre-ordered your dinner.

Parent Survey 2024 Analysis

In July 2024, we completed our annual parent survey. This year, we received 48 responses.

The leadership team has reviewed the responses and can present the following headlines:

- Percentages in most areas have either increased or stayed broadly in line with 2023 outcomes of the survey.
- The highest percentages agreeing or strongly agreeing were in the following categories: my child feels safe; Aldryngton makes sure its pupils are well-behaved; there is a good range of subjects at the school.
- Biggest increases have been in the school makes me aware of what my child will learn; my child has SEND and they have been given the support that they need; the school supports the wider personal development of my child.

Like any survey, there was a varied range of comments regarding what families thought was working well and what they felt required improving. However, the following areas were shared as strengths of the school by the largest number of responses:

- Academic excellence and strong teaching
- Staff are approachable, caring and kind.
- The sports days and swimming galas.
- The approaches used to teach reading and phonics.

















Please find a summary table of the areas most identified by families of requiring further improvement and the associated response:

Improvement Area	Response
School lunches in particular better-quality meat options and meat offered on all days.	We had a changeover in our kitchen team from June 2024 and since this time, we have noticed that there has been less waste.
	I have continued to sample the menu on a daily basis and provide feedback to the caterers every week. For its price, the meals are high quality. There are of course some menu items that are more popular than others. There are also some very good vegetarian options, the cheese whirl is a particular favourite. I appreciate that not all meals will be to everybody's tastes though.
	Caterlink have been operating a meat-free Monday for a while now as one of their sustainability objectives. We have also embraced this objective ourselves and support this decision.
	The menu has to be approved in line with nutritional guidelines and is the same as in other Caterlink schools. We do feedback what is popular and what is not. Caterlink are then known to make changes in response to this.
	Caterlink are open to parents feeding back specific issues/ requests relating to school dinners and there is an option do so via surveys that they run throughout the year.
Grounds requiring more maintenance	We had a successful working party last Saturday and it was amazing what was achieved in such a short time frame. We are looking at developing an asset management plan for the outdoor area to place a more strategic overview into managing our grounds.
Pool club not open at weekends	This particular area had the most responses in the survey wanting an improvement by far. As a result, we are currently working with the PTA in order to find a solution to increase the number of weekends that the pool is open next season.
More sports clubs for Lower School and Foundation Stage children	We will investigate to see if further options are available. Some of the external clubs that the school uses have had to either merge with more year groups and in some instances have not been cost-effective to run due to fewer children attending.
More feedback on homework tasks completed.	It is recognised at a national level that teacher workload is an issue and research in recent years has questioned the impact of written comments. Therefore, we adjusted our approach to marking and feedback several years ago. There is now a greater emphasis on verbal feedback and















future plans being adjusted in response to the findings of the teacher as they mark the work.

It is also understood the challenges sometimes faced by families in ensuring that their child completes the homework and therefore it can be understood why families may want more feedback. However, teachers can often have up to 90 books to mark per day in addition to the teaching commitments, planning the lessons, attending training and staff meetings as well as running clubs. We have made the strategic decision to focus the teacher efforts on areas that are known by research to have a greater impact on pupil progress.

We did review our Homework Policy in July 2024 and have now made it clear that written feedback will not be provided. We are also completing trials of MyMaths in Y1-4 at the moment, which provides immediate feedback to both the child and the teacher.

Thank you once again for all of you that completed this survey. As the survey was anonymous, it was not possible to provide individual feedback. However, if there is anything that you wish to raise specifically, then please contact the school office and we can triage your email to the most appropriate person to respond to you.

Falling Pupil Numbers in Earley Area

Accompanying the weekly update this week is a letter from Ming Zhang detailing the fact that in parts of the Wokingham Borough, pupil numbers are falling and there will be a need to look at reducing the planned admission number for certain schools. I am able to confirm that Earley is one of the areas identified where there is and will continue be a surplus of places. However, Aldryngton continues to be full and currently we have no plans to reduce our planned admission number. We have seen this year that families that live over a mile away from the school offered places, when traditionally only those in catchment areas would have been able to secure a place. If you are aware of any families looking at schools for next academic year, please direct them to one of our prospective parent open mornings. Due to falling numbers in the area, there is now a realistic probability of securing a place at Aldryngton living out of catchment.

OFSTED Update

The OFSTED inspection window has now opened again after this was paused due to the announcement that single word gradings for overall effectiveness would be removed. Instead the school will receive gradings in the following categories: Quality of Education; Personal Development; Behaviour and Attitudes; Leadership and Management; Early Years. As previously communicated, I am expecting that we will be inspected this term. After the inspection, grades and the report need to be finalised before the outcome is shared with families. This usually takes between 4-6 weeks after the initial inspection.
