Mathematics

Pupils should continue to work on knowing their times tables off by heart. Use TT Rockstars to help with rapid recall.

Practise multiplying 2 and 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers, e.g. 45×3 , 345×5 , etc. Use column multiplication and use a multiplication grid to help your child if they are unsure.

Practise numbers bonds to 10, 20 and/or 100 to help with mental calculation skills, e.g. $56 + ? = 100$, $100 - 45 = ?$ etc.

There will be a times-table test every Friday.

English - Writing

Pupils will be given spellings every week based on the spelling pattern they have been learning about in school. **The spellings they will need to learn will be sent home in a Spelling Book each Friday** so that you can work on them with your child at home in preparation for a spelling test the following Friday.

There are also **statutory spellings for Year 3 and 4** that do not follow specific rules. We will work on these in school, but if they could practise them at home too, that would be fantastic! Please find them attached.

English - Reading

All pupils should be reading at least 3 times every week, with an adult or independently. **Please ensure you record any reading (this does not have to be their reading book) in their reading diaries.**

Reading books and diaries should be in school every day. Read 5x a week to earn two Dojos.

There will also be Spellings set each week on Spelling Shed—the children have their log-in details on a bookmark.

Science - Animals including Humans

- Plan a menu for an evening meal, making sure it is balanced. Maybe you could even make it for your family (with some help!)
- Draw a plate of food and label all the food groups.
- Create snap cards to match different foods to their food group.
- Design a presentation to a different year group about healthy eating.
- Design and make a board game to encourage children to eat well.
- Research an animal of your choice. What is it? Where is it found? What does it eat? Which group of animals does it belong to? Is it a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore?

History - Castles

In history next term we will be learning about castles.

Draw a castle and label the parts you know.

Research a castle and make a fact file about it.
