

Science

States of Matter (Spring 1)

Pupils will sort materials into solids, liquids and gases. They will observe that some materials change state when heated or cooled and will be able to name them. They will use the terms evaporation and condensation and know how these processes are linked to the water cycle.

Plants (Spring 2)

Pupils will investigate the different functions of flowering plants and how flowers help with the life cycle of flowering plants. They will find out what plants need to grow and compare and contrast different varieties, taking into account their different locations and the suitability of it.

Maths

In line with White Rose maths scheme. The children will take part in a variety of mental maths, fluency, problem solving and reasoning activities. Our focus this term will continue to be Multiplication and Division, followed by Measures, Area and Perimeter. We will then move on to study Fractions—looking at both fractions of shapes, and, of amounts. We will also learn about equivalent fractions. This term, we will be continuing to work on our times-tables, focusing on improving our rapid recall of them.



All English lessons will have both reading and a range of writing skills/genres incorporated within them. Pupils will design their own mythical creature and write an exciting story containing their character.
