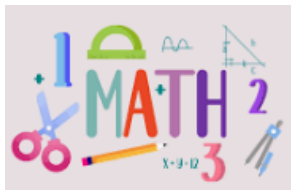

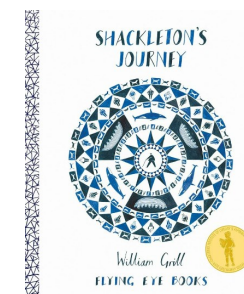

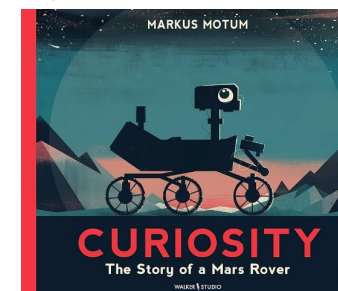

English

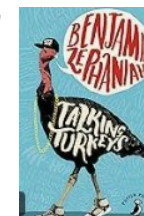
