We are incredibly proud of our students, who have shown resilience, maturity and a fantastic attitude throughout the week. They have continued to work hard, conducted themselves brilliantly during assessments.

Single Lunchtime

From September, we will move to a single lunchtime for all students. This change will allow us to better supervise students, improve behaviour and create a calmer, more organised environment. It will also give students more opportunities to take part in activities and enrichment. As part of this, Year 11 and Year 13 students will have sole use of the Cyber Café Diner and we will also develop an outdoor seating area in the Centenary Garden at the centre of the school. Staff will be available to run enrichment activities at lunchtime and we are excited about the opportunities this will bring for our students.

To reduce queuing times, we are also introducing digital kiosks. Students will be able to pre-order food during breakfast club at the start of the day, meaning they won't need to queue at break or lunchtime. Students will be issued with a lunch card that can be safely stored in their lanyard. Therefore, it is vitally important that all students wear their lanyards every day. Students who bring their lunch card each day will benefit from a quicker, more efficient service, helping them make the most of their break and lunchtime.

Secure phone pouches

Next week we will be sharing information with you regarding how we are moving to a full phone-free school system by introducing secure phone pouches in September. We encourage you to read this communication carefully, as it will contain important information about the new system and what you and your child need to know ahead of the new school year.

MCAS App for payments

From September 2026, we will be moving to the MyChildAtSchool (MCAS) app for all parent payments. This secure, easy-to-use system will allow you to manage school lunches, trips, equipment and other payments in one convenient place. We'll be sharing more information and support over the coming weeks to help make the transition as smooth as possible.

Behaviour and Support

We are continuing to strengthen our behaviour systems to ensure all students can learn in a calm and focused environment. From September 2026, our internal suspension provision will now be based in the Rectory building, running from 9:00am to 3:30pm. This allows us to provide clear boundaries while also offering appropriate support for students when needed.

Cycling to School

Riding a bike should be a safe way to travel, but we've seen some dangerous behaviour, including things like wheelies and riding without proper control on the roads outside school. This puts you and others at serious risk. If students choose to ride to school, they must do always so safely and responsibly. If we have concerns about how students are riding to or from school, they will not be allowed to store their bike in the secure bike area. This is a privilege, and it will be removed if it is misused.
