

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of another busy and productive half term at Alsop High School, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on recent developments and to thank you for your continued support.

A Mobile Phone-Free School

While we recognise the benefits mobile phones can offer, particularly for safety and communication during travel to and from school, they can also be a major distraction during the school day. Research consistently shows that student learning, focus and social development improve significantly when mobile devices are removed from the classroom environment.

From **Monday 16th June**, we will enforce our approach to make sure Alsop is a **mobile phone and AirPods- free school** during the school day. This decision reflects our core values of **Be Safe** and is part of our wider commitment to ensuring a calm, focused, and inclusive learning environment for every student.

As one of our school values is also **respect**, we will support students through the transition over the first two weeks after the half-term break, offering clear guidance, reminders and support before implementing any sanctions. Our approach, as always, will be fair, firm and kind.

Please be reassured that students will still be able to bring phones to school for use on their journey, but they must be switched off and out of sight as they enter the building. Initially, we will enforce our "never seen, not heard" policy:

- If a phone is seen or used during the school day, it will be confiscated.
- Confiscated devices will be returned at the school's discretion, either to the student or their parent/carer.

This marks the first step in implementing our mobile-free school policy. Over the coming weeks, I will share further developments on how we plan to strengthen our approach to mobile phone use, with the aim of supporting learning in classrooms and enhancing the mental health and wellbeing of our students as we begin the new term in September. This policy is fully in line with guidance from the **Department for Education (February 2024)** on mobile phone use in schools.


Year 11 & Year 13 Examinations

Assessments Year 7 - 10

For students in Years 7 to 10, the end-of-year assessment windows are scheduled as follows:

- Years 7 to 9: Monday 2nd June to Friday 20th June
- Year 10: Monday 16th June to Friday 27th June

To enable your child to prepare for their assessments, they will receive revision materials from their teachers. Please support them at home by encouraging them to complete this work. This is important to ensure working at home becomes a positive learning habit, building academic resilience and is vital for student success. These assessments will accurately assess your child's progress and you will receive detailed information about their academic performance in an end of year report. The specific arrangements for the assessments will be sent out in the coming weeks.

Student Exit Procedure – 3:00pm

To further enhance student safety and improve supervision at the end of the school day, we will be updating our exit procedure. From Monday 9th June, all students will exit via Student Services.

Regular attendance is vital not only for academic achievement but also for building a strong sense of belonging and community.
