Dear Parent/Carer,

Further to the announcement made by the National Education Union (NEU) that its members have voted to take strike action, and based on reviewing our offer and staffing levels from the previous strike day, I can confirm the following arrangements for **Tuesday 28th February 2023**:

On **Tuesday 28th February 2023**, onsite provision will be available for those children who are classed as **vulnerable students only, as detailed below**, and contact has been made with families / students who are eligible to attend. All other students across Year 7 to 13 should not attend school, unless they are contacted by the school. Students will be able to access remote work as detailed overleaf.

Please carefully read the information below to ensure you are aware of the provision which will be available to your child:

Vulnerable students

Vulnerable children include children who are supported by social care, those with safeguarding and welfare needs, including child in need plans, on child protection plans, 'looked after' children, young carers, disabled children and those with education, health and care (EHC) plans will be expected to attend school as normal. Students will participate in small group work & personal development sessions. Please click [the link](#) for more information on the criteria for vulnerable children.

For all vulnerable students any non-attendance will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Our usual first day response to absence will be applied, such as contact with parents and home visits where appropriate, in keeping with our usual policies.

Arrangements / timings of the day for vulnerable students

The school will be open from 8.15am and all students who are expected to attend must be on-site for 8:25am as usual. Breakfast will be provided, as usual, in the Jamieson Restaurant and registers will be completed there before transferring to classrooms for the day. The school day will end at the usual time of 2.45pm, with public bus services running as normal.

Students are to enter, as usual, through the Walton Village Student Entrance and are required to wear their normal uniform at all times. Our usual high standards and expectations as detailed in our behaviour policy remain in place to ensure we maintain a safe environment for our students and staff.

Lunch Arrangements for those attending school on Tuesday 28th February

Lunch will be provided in the Jamieson Restaurant for all vulnerable students.

Free School Meals for those not attending school on Tuesday 28th February

If your child receives free school meals and is not expected to attend school on Tuesday 28th February, please be assured that a meal will be provided and your child will be able to collect a packed lunch at the end of the day on Monday 27th February from the Jamieson Restaurant as they exit school. On-line / remote education

Students who are not expected to attend school will be able to access on-line work using any digital device including desktop PC, laptop, tablet, game console or mobile phone with data access. The links to work for Tuesday 28th February will be uploaded onto Class Charts and Teams in advance. If your child does not have access to a digital device, please email your child's Head of Year or call school on 0151 235 1200 by Monday 27th February so paper copies can be collated and shared.

Further information

On the industrial strike day(s) there will be a core body of staff supervising the school as follows:

- Headteacher, Deputy Headteachers and Assistant Headteachers
- Designated safeguarding professionals and attendance officers, monitoring daily attendance of those students that are expected to attend.
- Administrative staff, ensuring switchboards are staffed and able to respond to enquiries.
- A core of staff delivering a programme of activities on a rota basis.
- Catering and cleaning teams.

Finally, in order to effectively safeguard those students who are expected to attend the school on this day, we politely ask that parents inform us by 8.00am if their child is unable to attend on that day. This absence should be communicated by calling our normal student absence line.
