These examinations are a vital part of your child's academic development and serve as valuable preparation for their final GCSE examinations in Year 11. The results from these PPEs will help identify both strengths and areas that may need further attention, allowing students and teachers to target their efforts effectively in the coming months. They will determine the sets your child starts Year 11 in, they will determine the Period 0 intervention classes your child is placed in and in some subjects will inform decisions that will need to be made regarding the entry of tier for that examination.

We encourage all students to approach these examinations with seriousness and dedication, making full use of the revision materials and support available to them. Students should arrive at school punctually each day and attend their morning tutor time, where they will receive final instructions for the exams scheduled that day.

Any absent students will receive a phone call and potentially a home visit to escort them to the examination if no valid reason for absence is provided.

Students are expected to wear full school uniform each day, except on days when they have PE, in which case they may attend in full PE kit.
