Revision Tips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You will be given unit checklists in class. Use these in your revision to make sure no areas in each unit are left uncovered. RAG the unit checklist to identify areas of priority for revision in preparation for the exams. • Remember in your revision that you must focus on knowledge (AO1)- learning the key facts, application (AO2), analysis (AO3) and evaluation (AO4). Could you answer a 25-mark question on each of the topics? • Practice answering the longer answer questions, for 10, 12, 15 and 25 marks. Make sure you are comfortable with the breakdown of knowledge, application, analysis and evaluation for each type of question. • Remember to focus on key terms in your revision- a question may have a specific key term in it. If you do not know the key term you will not be able to answer the question! • Find the revision style that works best for you! Some people like mind-maps, some crunch notes, some cue cards! You need to find the method that works best for you to ensure your revision is effective.
