

During November 2022 students from Alsop High School were privileged to participate in the Lessons from Auschwitz programme organised by the Holocaust Educational Trust.

We experienced at first hand the horrors of the **Genocide** which occurred in Nazi occupied Europe.







Holocaust Memorial Day

GENOCIDE refers to violent crimes committed against groups with the intent to destroy the existence of the group.

GENOCIDE is an act out of the ordinary that disturbs the natural order of things, hijacking ordinary places and their original purpose.

Dr Martin Stern MBE, a Holocaust survivor recalls:

Learning from genocide

"As a five year old, I could stand at the edge of the clearing where the trains were being loaded. People like sardines in those wooden trucks. And the people loading them in - they were railway men, they didn't look terribly different from the railway men who check my tickets these days - they looked like ordinary people."









Holocaust Memorial Day

Abe Leson recalls:

"Two hundred Lithuanian railway workers murdered more than 60 Jewish men in August 1941, shooting them into a pit that had been dug by Russian prisoners of war.

"The railway workers deliberately placed large motors near the pit so that the noise of the shooting wouldn't be heard by other Jews who were being kept nearby."

Holocaust Memorial Day

Léon Bronchart was a French railway worker who assisted his Jewish neighbours by hiding a Jew and for refusing to drive a train containing political prisoners.

Marcel Hoffman was one of 24 French railway workers who helped save Jewish children from deportation in September 1942.

Jean Louis Mazimpaka, a survivor in Rwanda, recalls:

'When the killing started, to be honest, everyone was involved. Our neighbours, friends, but we didn't know the killings were to the extent of what happened."

Kemal Pervanić, survivor, Bosnia writes:

"People may think that they have nothing to do with my story. It may sound too hard to believe but this doesn't happen to strangers who live far away. I'm just an ordinary person. These terrible things can happen to people like us."

Sir Nicholas Winton, rescued 669 children from the Holocaust.

"Why are you making such a big deal out of it? I just helped a little; I was in the right place at the right time."




