Character

Promote self-management skills, helping children to be organised and independent learners.

Provide opportunities for children to be active learners, working in flexible groupings or independently to achieve their goals.

Encourage children to form opinions, communicate ideas and challenge other people's thinking in a suitable and empathetic manner.

Support children to be inquisitive and reflective learners, who have the skills to improve their work and the work of others.

Provide children with the skills to communicate effectively and have the confidence to share their ideas in different ways to different audiences.

Provide opportunities for children's knowledge and understanding to be applied across the curriculum in different contexts.

Enable children to follow the teaching and example of Jesus as expressed in the Gospels.

Provide opportunities for pupils to develop their understanding of people from a wider range of different backgrounds, within our local community and beyond, with particular regard to Catholic Social Teaching.
