
Awarded for achievements in their work.

NHS Dental Check-Up Initiative for Children Aged 16 and Under

We are working with local primary schools and community groups to support children who are **not currently registered with a dental practice**. The aim of this initiative is to help all children access routine NHS dental care and build positive dental habits from an early age.

What's involved?

- Children will be invited to attend a routine NHS dental check-up
- If any treatment is needed, this will also be offered under the NHS
- Once a parent, carer or responsible adult gets in touch with us, our team will arrange the child's appointment directly with them.

Who the initiative is for?

This initiative is for children **aged 16 and under** who are **not registered with a dentist**.

It is open to all families and care arrangements, and we welcome enquiries from anyone supporting a child who needs access to dental care.

How to take part
