As you can see, they have had a wonderful time making and especially eating!

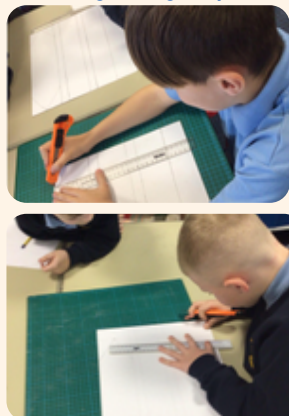


Year 3

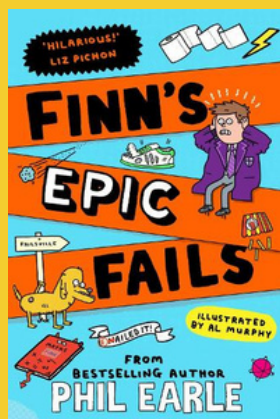
