This week in computing, Year 2 children have been using bee bots and laptops to program directions in a sequence.



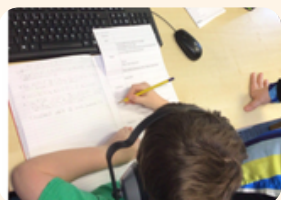
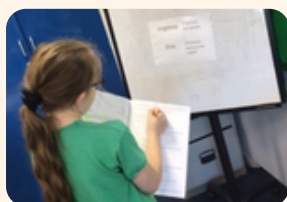
Year 3

Year 3 have been using balloons to practise their racket and hand-eye coordination skills in their badminton lessons.



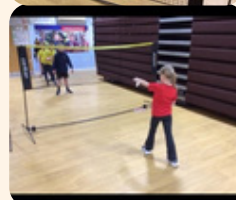
Year 4
