Dear Families,

We have enjoyed a very busy start to the spring term. All our children have returned to school with a real thirst for learning and are flourishing as a result.

Christian Distinctiveness

At the start of this term, the children were introduced to 'Stilling - seeing things more clearly'. Stilling is an ancient practice using breathing techniques, so that a person can become aware of oneself and one's surroundings. This introduces a simplified form of the Ignatian Examen technique and at the same time in the hope to improve children's mental health and to develop their own understanding of spirituality.

Stilling was introduced to the children with a jar of muddy water. What does this mean?

When we are busy and active, our distractions, thoughts, worries and fears swirl around inside us like the little bits of mud in the jar of water. When we are still, these little bits of mud eventually sink to the bottom. They don't disappear, but they aren't in control: we can see them more clearly, we can name them and we can leave them there. And then we can see other things more clearly; we can see ourselves, others, our world and even God (if we are open to him).

This practice has been used across many Church of England schools with such a positive impact that we wanted our children to be given the same opportunity. Ask your child/ren about this very new addition to the school week as we'd welcome your feedback too.
