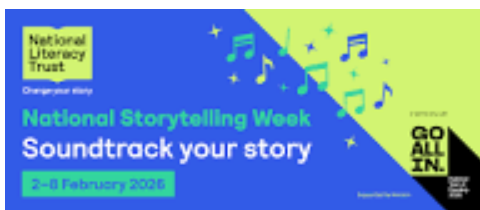

Part of the National Year of Reading, this week we have been focussing on Storytelling.



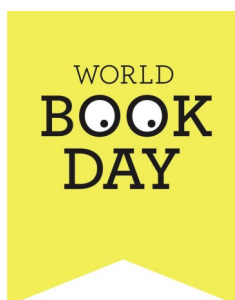
Reception had Rachel, our Chair of Governors read 'Zog' to them - she was most impressed with their Zog knowledge!

MAKE YOUR CHILD AN ATTENDANCE HERO

Attendance at school is important: we thought we'd share the guidelines and the current fine structure.

Parents' Responsibility:

Parents are legally responsible for ensuring their child receives a "full-time, suitable education." If a child is registered at a school, this means they must attend **every day** the school is open.



School's Responsibility:

Schools must record attendance twice daily (morning and afternoon sessions). They are required to share this data daily with the Department for Education (DfE).

"Persistent Absence" Threshold

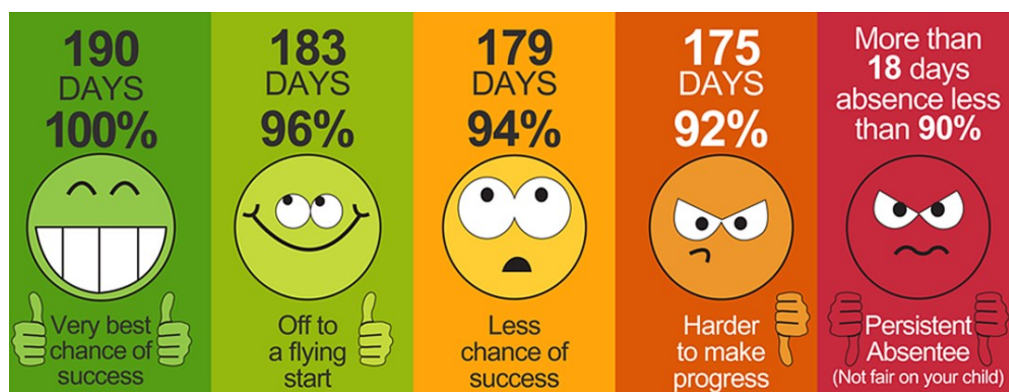
A student is classified as a persistent absentee if their attendance falls to 90% or below (equivalent to missing one day every fortnight). Once a student hits this threshold, schools are required to intervene, often starting with "Improvement Notices" or supportive meetings to identify barriers to attendance.

Offence	Fine Amount	Details
First Fine	£80 (if paid in 21 days)	Rises to £160 if paid between 22–28 days.
Second Fine	£160 (flat rate)	Issued if a second offence occurs within a 3-year rolling period.
Third Offence	Prosecution	Fines are capped at two within 3 years. A third offence leads to court.

THESE FINES ARE ISSUED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITY.

FINES ARE ISSUED PER PARENT, PER CHILD. FOR EXAMPLE, TWO PARENTS TAKING TWO CHILDREN ON AN UNAUTHORISED HOLIDAY COULD FACE FOUR SEPARATE FINES.

If you have concerns about your child's attendance, please speak to your class teacher at parent's evening - they will have the up-to-date attendance figures for your child
