YEAR 6 TEA PARTY:

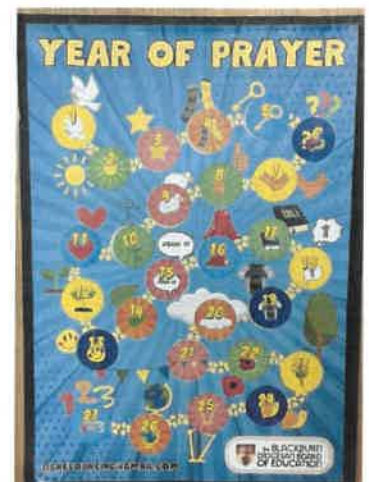
Monday saw the annual tea party hosted by Year 6. Those in the school community who have helped our school throughout the year are invited for a cuppa, a cake and a chat!

Year of Prayer

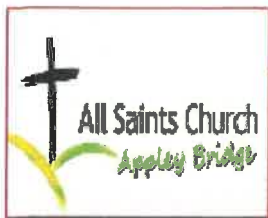
Thanks to Blackburn Diocese Board of Education for the Year of Prayer which we have completed this week.

Skelmersdale Foodbank

On Tuesday 15th July, four children from Y6 visited the food bank in Skelmersdale to deliver the money raised at their recent charity day.

We delivered £220 and Amanda from the bank gave us a tour of what they do. Amanda explained that our donation of £220 would help provide support for 60 families. The warehouse was full when we visited but Amanda said it would be empty again 24 hours later. We found out in 2007 they distributed 9174 parcels in the year. In 2023 they distributed 2,986,203 showing a greater need for those in need.
