Assessment and Intervention

ASSESSMENT:

Year 2 to Year 6 spellings are assessed during weekly spelling quizzes and dictations and through the application of spelling rules in independent writing.

INTERVENTION:

Intervention in Year 2 to Year 6 is planned by teachers for children not on track with their phonics and spelling. Intervention is carried out by teachers or teaching assistants. Personalised sessions are planned for individual children or small groups. We use precision teaching and have IDL, Nesy, Fast Track Phonics and Bounce Back Phonics programmes available for use.
