

School Uniform

All pupils at All Saints' are expected to wear the school uniform. Our uniform has been chosen so it is affordable to our All Saints' families and is easy to obtain. Parents can choose whether to buy our school uniform with our badge on it or plain uniform. The choice is yours.

We want our children to look smart in their school uniform. This really reflects the aims of our school and gives everyone a sense of belonging.

Main Uniform:

- Royal jumper or cardigan (with or without school badge)
- Pale blue polo shirt (with or without the school badge) Grey trousers or shorts, skirt, pinafore, skorts. (In Summer, white/blue gingham dress)
- Black smart school shoes with heels no higher than 2cm, no open toes or sling back shoes. **(no trainers)**

PE Kit

- Plain navy blue or black shorts
- PE T-shirt – royal blue for St. Andrew's, red for St. David's, white for St. George and green for St. Patrick's.
- Pumps or trainers for outdoor PE

In Winter plain black tracksuit bottoms or leggings may be worn

Our plain uniform is available to buy at affordable prices in our local supermarkets. We also have an extensive pre-loved uniform range available from school for a donation per item.

Please clearly label all coats, jumpers and other items of clothing with the child's name. The school cannot be held responsible for missing items of clothing that are un-named.

Jewellery and Hair

The Governors have decided that in the interest of the children's safety, no jewellery should be worn in school, other than a watch and ear studs. No ear studs are allowed during PE. They must be removed or, if within 6 weeks of piercing, covered by the child.

Children are not expected to wear any form of make-up in school, for example painted fingernails, fake tan or eye make-up.

In the interests of safety, health and concentration, long hair (collar length or more) should be properly tied back e.g. plaits, bunches etc. to help prevent the spread of headlice. . We find that a neat, tidy appearance helps to create a good work ethic. Neither completely shaved heads (minimum cut "Number 2") nor patterns shaved into longer hair are allowed. Children's hair should be its natural colour therefore it is not permitted to bleach, dye or colour hair or add coloured hair extensions. Hair wraps and beaded hair should be held back with a hair band to reduce the risk of injury to the child and others
