## Luke 14:25-22

<sup>25</sup> Great crowds accompanied him on his way and he turned and spoke to them.<sup>26</sup> 'Anyone who comes to me without hating father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, cannot be my disciple.'<sup>27</sup> No one who does not carry his cross and come after me can be my disciple.<sup>28</sup> 'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it?<sup>29</sup> Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, anyone who saw it would start making fun of him and saying,<sup>30</sup> "Here is someone who started to build and was unable to finish."<sup>31</sup> Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who was advancing against him with twenty thousand?<sup>32</sup> If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace.<sup>33</sup> So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple without giving up all that he owns.



## Online Safety Reminder

We would like to remind parents and carers of the importance of regularly checking the suitability of online games and apps that children are accessing, paying particular attention to age restrictions. Social media platforms are not recommended for secondary school pupils, and we encourage you to have appropriate monitoring and parental controls in place on your child's phone and other devices at home. Recently, concerns have been raised regarding a gaming app called "*Conquer Countries*." We continue to share online safety advice and updates from the South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL) and ChildNet, to support you in keeping your child safe online – these are regularly posted on our school Facebook page.



## Road Safety

Please take a moment to speak with your child about the importance of keeping themselves safe when walking or cycling to and from school.

As you know, St Vincent's Road, Garstang Road, and Sharoe Green Lane are all extremely busy both before and after school. Mr Catlow, Mr Haslam, and other members of the Senior Leadership Team are stationed at the front of school during these times to support pupils crossing the roads. However, we have received reports of some near misses, with pupils stepping out into the road in front of vehicles.

We kindly ask that you encourage your child to use the designated crossings on Garstang Road and Sharoe Green Lane. It may mean walking a little further, but it is by far the safer option. All pupils who cycle to school **MUST** wear a cycle helmet and we will be checking when they arrive to school that they are following this very important safety rule.

As always, Year 7 pupils will take part in their **Streetwise Road Safety Talk on 15th September**.




