Message from Mr Catlow

A Message to Our Community

Many of you will be aware of the tragic loss of one of our pupils earlier this year.

The death of a child is an unimaginable tragedy. No parent should ever have to experience such a loss, and the impact extends far beyond the immediate family. It is felt deeply by friends, classmates, staff, and the wider community who have all played a part in supporting and nurturing a young life.

Whilst time may soften some of the pain, such a loss is never truly behind us. Our thoughts and prayers remain with Nina's family and all those who continue to grieve. Her memory will always remain in the hearts of those who knew her.

Until now, I have chosen not to comment publicly. It has felt important to respect the ongoing process and, most importantly, the family at the centre of this tragedy. However, following this week's inquest and the publication of the Coroner's findings, I feel it is appropriate to address our community.

The Coroner's report is now a matter of public record. Whilst it can bring no comfort that would lessen the pain of losing a child, it does provide clarity regarding a number of claims and allegations that have circulated on social media in recent months. Throughout this period, members of our staff and the wider

Archbishop Temple community have been subjected to criticism and speculation, much of it based on misinformation and, in many cases, shared by individuals with little direct knowledge of the circumstances.

I am immensely proud of the staff of Archbishop Temple. Every day they dedicate themselves to the care, education, and wellbeing of the young people entrusted to us. Their commitment to our pupils is unwavering, and they continue to serve our community with professionalism, compassion, and integrity.

As a school, we welcome accountability. During my time as Headteacher, we have undergone two Ofsted inspections and are preparing for a forthcoming Church school inspection. We regularly invite external evaluation and challenge because we believe that reflection and scrutiny help us to improve and better serve our pupils and families.

We also recognise the enormous trust parents place in us when they send their children to school each day. That is why I have always sought to maintain an open-door approach. Prospective and current parents are welcome to visit, ask questions, and see our school in action. We are proud of our community and of the care we provide for our young people.

Like any organisation, we are not perfect. We continually strive to improve and will always reflect honestly when things can be done better. Our vision is centred on the flourishing of every child, academically, personally, spiritually, and socially. We seek to uphold high standards whilst ensuring that every decision is guided by the best interests of our pupils.

The publication of the Coroner's report cannot undo the heartbreak of what has happened. My hope is simply that it brings greater understanding and helps bring an end to the misinformation that has caused additional hurt to members of our school community.

Above all else, our focus remains where it should be: on remembering Nina and supporting those who continue to feel her loss.

Please continue to keep Nina's family in your thoughts and prayers.

May she rest in peace.

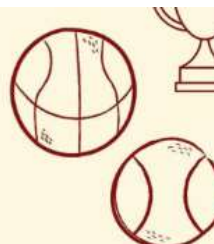


A selection of Year 9 and Year 10 students represented the school superbly on Monday as they led the Preston Primary School Sports Festival.

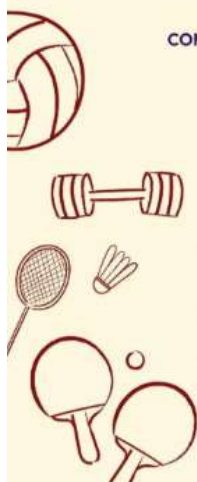

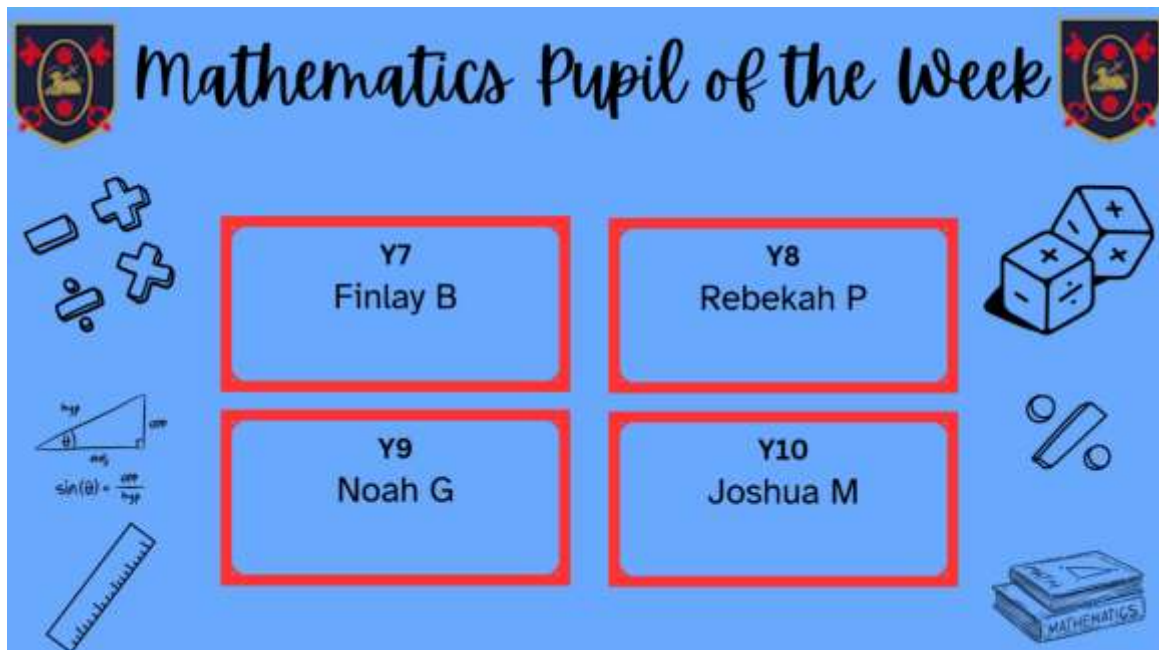

Spanish Trip to Sevilla – Important Information

Dear Parents and Carers of students attending the MFL Sevilla Trip in October 2026,

Could you please send pupils' passports and GHIC card to school from Monday 22nd to Friday 26th June? School needs to submit the required passport information to the tour company over the next few weeks. This is a necessary requirement for online check-in procedures. Passports will be returned to pupils the following week. The required passport information can be submitted to the travel company. Please remember that UK passports must have at least **3 months' validity remaining** after your planned return date.

Please note that students who hold a **non-UK passport** may require a Schengen Visa in order to travel to Spain. Schengen Visas can be applied for through the Spanish Consulate in Manchester or London. It is extremely important that any required visa is obtained well in advance of the trip in October.

Failure to apply for and obtain the necessary visa may result in a pupil being unable to board the flight to Spain. For further information regarding Schengen Visa applications, please visit the Spanish Foreign Office website:

In addition, all pupils will need to bring a valid GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card), which provides access to healthcare whilst abroad.
