Message from Mr Catlow

Over the summer Robbie Williams made headlines by saying he won't let his daughter have a mobile phone. His reason was simple: childhood is precious, and phones can rob young people of it too soon. His comments struck a chord with me, because in schools we see both the benefits and the downsides of mobiles every single day.

There's no doubt that phones are powerful. They keep us connected, give instant answers, and open doors to the world. But for teenagers, they can also bring constant comparison, late-night scrolling, pressures from social media, and distractions from learning. The research is clear: too much screen time can affect sleep, confidence, and wellbeing.

That's why boundaries matter. Saying “not yet” to a phone, or setting firm rules about when and how it's used, isn't about being strict—it's about protecting young people at a time when they need guidance more than ever. As Robbie Williams pointed out, childhood doesn't last forever. Giving children time without the constant pull of a phone helps them focus on friendships, hobbies, family life, and, importantly, their own sense of self.

At Archbishop Temple, we work hard to strike the right balance with technology. In school, mobiles don't dominate, so that learning and real connection can. At home, I encourage you to feel confident in setting your own boundaries. Your child may tell you “everyone else has one”—but the truth is, more families than you might think are quietly taking the same careful approach.

Together, we can help our young people use technology wisely, not let it use them.
