## Luke 17:11-19

### Jesus Heals Ten Men With Leprosy

11 Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. 12 As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy[a] met him. They stood at a distance 13 and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" 14 When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. 15 One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. 16 He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. 17 Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? 18 Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" 19 Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

## Message from Mr Catlow

Vaping has become increasingly popular among young people in recent years, often marketed as a safer alternative to smoking. However, emerging evidence and local incidents in Lancashire highlight serious risks—especially from contaminated and illicit vape products. As a school committed to the wellbeing of our students, I feel it's important to share the latest information I have with you.

Lancashire County Council's Health and Wellbeing Board recently raised concerns about the sharp increase in vaping among under-18s. A Trading Standards survey found that nearly half of 14–17-year-olds had tried e-cigarettes, often drawn in by fruit flavours, colourful packaging, and low prices.

In just three months (April–June 2023), over 20,000 non-compliant or illicit vapes were seized from local retailers, many of which were being sold illegally to minors. These products are not only unregulated but may contain harmful substances that pose serious health risks.

Police in Lancaster and Morecambe have reported multiple cases of teenagers falling ill and requiring hospital treatment after using contaminated vapes. These incidents underline the dangers of unregulated products, which may contain unknown chemicals, excessive nicotine, or even toxic additives.

A recent study from Lancaster University (with reference to Bristol research) emphasises that while vaping may help adult smokers quit tobacco, it is not safe for children and young people. Nicotine remains highly addictive, and its effects on developing brains are still being studied. The research also warns of the environmental impact of disposable vapes and the need for stronger prevention and cessation efforts.

### What can we do as parents

- Talk openly with your child about vaping and its risks.
- Be aware of the signs: sweet smells, unfamiliar devices, or changes in behaviour.
- Check packaging and educate your child about how marketing targets young people.
- Support school policies and local campaigns aimed at reducing youth vaping.

I encourage all parents to remain vigilant and informed. If you have concerns or would like support, please reach out to our pastoral team. Together, we can help protect our young people from the hidden dangers of vaping.

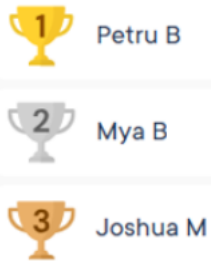
